# **MOVING ISSUES**

### **MOVING ON**

As you know Jenny and I are moving at the end of June. Many of us are conservative by nature and dislike change. However, our circumstances often present us with a constantly moving picture and we are reminded that life is frequently described as a journey. This is particularly true for the Christian. Jesus gave us some instructions for our journey when He said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind; and, love your neighbour as yourself (Luke 10:27)"

## **MOVING UP**

Our relationship with God is the most important. We often take this for granted but we should be seeking to know God better and become more like Him. "Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into Him who is the Head, that is, Christ (<u>Eph 4:15</u>)." This also speaks of moving on in our relationships with others.

## **MOVING IN**

Tertullian, a Christian theologian writing in 200AD, described how outsiders saw Christians: "Look," they say, "how they love one another" (for they themselves hate one another); "and how they are ready to die for each other" (for they themselves are readier to kill each other). We must continue to become what we are in Christ and grow in unity, not only in our parishes but also across the Mission Community to which we all belong. It is inevitable that we shall have differences of opinion from time to time but it is how we deal with these which can be such a powerful witness.

## **MOVING OUT**

A former Archbishop of Canterbury, William Temple, once said," The Church is the only society that exists for the benefit of those who are not its members." The last thing that Jesus told his disciples was, "go and make disciples of all nations" (Mat 28:19). 'Tiggs' Pearson-Miles reminded us powerfully of this at our recent Rogation Sunday Service. If we are to move outwards we must be prepared not only to make our church services more accessible but also to leave the safety of our buildings and take the message of God's saving love in Jesus Christ to the needy world outside.

In all this let us remember that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (<u>Hebrews 13:8</u>). As we say farewell we thank God, "because of your partnership in the Gospel...., being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Phil.1v5, 6).

## CHRISTIANITY EXPLORED at Oakford

he course was started at the end of January with an informal meal and a chat about the format that it would take. It was held in Oakford Village hall and we sat around a large table so that we could all see each other easily. After a really nice meal, John Roberts gave everyone a course book, which was based on the Gospel of St. Mark and advised us how the course would work, with groups of about eight or so discussing the coursework in the handbook and then watching a DVD and finally in groups again to talk about what they had seen, and the next week's session. The course was thought-provoking and the presenter on the DVD, Rico Tice, was excellent. The whole thing was well organized and thought through.

Preparation of food for each week, which was excellent, was soon sorted out with different people volunteering to do it. It was chatty and friendly, and with the table nicely arranged, it was easy to get to know one another. This made it more relaxing when we split into groups to be able to put our thoughts into words and how we saw the questions and points raised in the course. Apart from learning a good deal more about St. Mark's gospel it also helped us to understand each other better, even if we didn't always agree. We averaged about sixteen people each week and although most were regular churchgoers, it was the first course attended by several people. All said they enjoyed it and maybe were a little surprised that it could be so informal and vet so informative.

3. Pour mixture onto crumbs.

4. Cover with remaining crumbs.

5. Leave in the fridge overnight. This pudding will freeze too.
