# **DEANERY SYNOD**

9th JUNE, AT TEMPLETON

We began with a talk by Andrew Godsall, a canon at Exeter Cathedral. He was amusing, relevant and thought provoking; though his jumping from subject to subject, with great speed and dexterity, makes it difficult to write a report!! He started by talking about the new training, and explaining that clergy now have continuous training and assessments, and review of their work. This must be a good thing, as it stops them from getting stale. He talked about administration and education within the church.

Andrew then talked about his life. He used to be a sound engineer working for the BBC, and compared the BBC, where everyone is equal, and on first name terms, with the church, where the rector is addressed as rector, and, when he trained, women were definitely lesser mortals than the men. (This has now changed!) Initially, he found it difficult to get his head round this change of culture. He talked about having a vision, and bringing it to reality, when creating something. On the subject of problems, he dwelt on the difference between the means and ends achieved. He also talked about the importance of connecting church with everyday life; also, that progress involves risks, and both ministers and the ministered to, should work together, taking such risks as a partnership as the work in a parish develops.

He also explained the new terms and conditions of vicars' employment. There

# Loxbeare

t is sad to report the death of the Rev'd Hugh Pollock, who was curate here in Loxbeare from October 1968 - 1963. Being a young unmarried man, Hugh spent many hours around the parishes encouraging parishioners of all ages. He was the first minister to play the guitar, and young people flocked in to the churches. After leaving the group, Hugh joined the staff of Lee Abbey, and later moved with his family to Dressingham in Norfolk, where he sang to the Queen Mother at a W.I. meeting. In later years he worked in north and south Devon before his retirement. Hugh lived his faith to the end, and was a fine example to us all. We send our love, prayers and deepest sympathy to Simon, Katy, Isobel, Scott and their families.

Also the death of Mrs Grace Herniman, whose late husband Rev'd Ronald Herniman was the first Rector when the Exe Valley Group of churches was formed. lose our village church, whether it be for historical, traditional reasons, or for family christenings, marriages, and funerals, but unfortunately the truth is it will close if we don't all work together to prevent this happening.

For those who are unaware of its history, a church has been on this site for 700 years. Originally it was built by wealthy knights returning from the Crusades in the Holy Land, and it was named St. Margret, after St. Margret of Antioch, by the Knights Templar in the late 13th century.

Many feel it is worth preserving and, to that end, a group met on 21st June when the Treasurer informed us that this year's deficit was £3,000. A recent inspection of the church has shown that many repairs are needed, some quite urgently. These include the Tower and the Bell Chamber, which would cost well over £20,000. Our church cannot afford this, and has indeed been struggling for some time to meet repair and running costs. Therefore, to start this enterprise, the first phase will be launched at the Templeton Fete in August. Those who are unable to attend will be contacted. We do hope you can support our village church.

We were sorry to see the Rev'd Andrew and Jenny Rose leave the Exe Valley in June, but we look forward to welcoming Rev'd Steven Goodbody and his wife Sarah in September.
