# - A Street Pastor's Question

At a recent Churchwardens' Council of the Exe Valley Mission Community we welcomed Chris and Julia, two members of the Tiverton Street Pastors Team, who presented a most instructive Power-point and talk about the work of the Street Pastors in Tiverton.

You may or may not be aware that on each Saturday Night (and hopefully, as the scheme develops, Friday nights also) a team of 4 Christians from various local churches are on the streets from 10.00pm to 3.30am Sunday morning, offering support and, if necessary, physical help to young people and others who are out and about in the town for a "Good Time". These trained Street Pastors work in conjunction with the local police and emergency services on any situation that might develop, whether illness, persons reported missing, or arranging for people to get home safely. One of the more mundane. but effective, ministries is the distribution of "Flip Flop" shoes to those whose evening footwear does not prove helpful after a few drinks!

But the four Pastors on the streets at any one time are not the total force involved. Twenty people were commissioned by Bishop Bob Evens on 20th March this year, and the whole team on any one evening can involve most of these. What are the rest doing? I quote from the 1st Newsletter "We all met at base at 9.30pm which gave us time to pray for the team before they went out. The police met us there for a briefing before the Street Pastors went out on the streets. ..... We prayed a lot (during the evening) ...... When the phone went and the team rang it was great. It always gave us more to pray for, even if it was just for an area of Tiverton itself. Sometimes we

prayed for individual Street Pastors, sometimes for people they had met and were talking to at the time, sometimes for situations".

It was clear, from the presentation that Chris and Julia gave, that prayer was at the centre of all that goes on, Some are praying in the base at the CHAT offices, some prayer partners pray at home, but there is no way these individuals can continue this work without prayer support.

But maybe the question arises in your mind (as I must confess it has in mine in the past) why all this time, effort and inconvenience over those who wish to "enjoy" themselves by drinking too much and causing problems on the night streets of Tiverton? Surely the answer must lie in the core of the Gospel itself? Yes, Jesus asks us to be neighbours to those whose lifestyles we might not wish to copy, but I think it is even more basic than this. If we ask ourselves why Jesus came in the first place, and then, why He freely chose to offer Himself as a sacrifice on the cross, we come nearer to the truth about ourselves; and therefore we can see how hypocritical it is to point the finger at those in Tiverton on a Saturday night. For the Bible is clear that we all - yes each one of us – has turned away from a Holy God. We read in Isaiah's prophecy "We all like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way...". Yes that describes me, and you, and those on the streets of Tiverton, both revellers and Street Pastors!

So the Street Pastors are modelling Jesus' way of service and love – what an example to us all! And Isaiah goes on to say "....The Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all". So let us praise and thank him, as we pray for the Street Pastors!

## **HOME HEATING**

As autumn closes in, more and more people start preparing for the colder seasons and arranging their insulation measures. Be canny and cosy this year by beating the rush and getting your insulation installed during the summer.

Right now there is funding available for all homeowners and private tenants in Devon to offer free and heavily discounted prices on loft and cavity wall insulation.

Installing insulation in your home can save you up to  $\pounds$ 340pa off your heating bill and can reduce your carbon dioxide emissions, making your home greener, as well as helping you stay warm and cosy.

of income is needed to achieve temperatures required to maintain health and comfort. We know, for instance, that many pensioners will skip meals in order to pay for heating.

Clearly one way of addressing this, as a matter of pastoral care and justice, is to encourage people to better insulate their homes. CosyDevon helps by offering free or discounted insulation to homeowners and private tenants if they are in a 'priority group'being over 70 or receiving benefits such as Income Support, Housing Benefit State Pension Credits or Disablement Allowances. CosyDevon also offers generous discounts to those outside of this group.

We are encouraging our churches to refer people to this opportunity and this is the right time to make plans for next winter. You can either refer people to us or (preferably) direct to CosyDevon based in Plymouth free on 0800 512012 quoting 012 as a reference, or via the website www.cosydevon.co.uk

This scheme has health, environmental and economic benefits and if you can help to promote in your parish or Mission Community it is a positive example of Social Responsibility in local action. The Diocese will receive a small fee for every completed installation, but our reasons for doing this are to address real concerns of people suffering from colder temperatures and also to reduce carbon emissions by wasting less energy.
