WHO DO YOU SAY I AM?

On one occasion, Jesus Christ was travelling along a hot and dusty track with some of his closest followers. As they walked, he turned to his disciples and asked them a question: "Who do people say I am?" (Mark 8v27).

It was a safe question to ask. It did not require any great personal commitment from the disciples. So they reported the kind of things that people were saying about Jesus: "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets".

If you ask the same question today, you get a very different set of answers: "Some say a great teacher; others say a political revolutionary; and still others, a visitor from another planet". There are many different ideas about the identity of Jesus Christ, ranging from the sublime to the ridiculous. Most of us enjoy a good discussion about which theory makes the most sense.

But as they walked along that dusty track, Jesus then asked his followers a second question. This time it was a far more personal question and a far greater challenge: "But what about you? Who do you say I am?"

It is one thing to enjoy a lively debate about the various possible explanations of the identity of Jesus, but it is a very different thing to come to a conclusion and to nail your colours to the mast. Yet, sooner or later, we must all do so. We must make our decision about who we say Jesus is, and we must also live with the consequences of our decision.

If we decide that Jesus was anything less than the person he claimed to be, then we are effectively saying that he was a liar, or perhaps that he was deluded. In either case, he would clearly not who he claimed to be - Lord, God, King and Saviour - then we will want to give him our unswerving loyalty, our full devotion and our whole-hearted obedience. If we believe that he speaks the truth, then we must trust him, follow him and worship him.

No-one can remain neutral towards Jesus Christ; he is either everything to us or nothing to us. That is why we each need to answer his question: "But what about you? Who do you say I am?"

ANN'S NATURE NOTES

t is now approaching high summer, the migrant birds are all here, and the spring bulbs have given way to Rhododendrons and Granny's Bonnets. The banks are verdant with lush grass and Queen Anne's Lace (Cow Parsley) drooping into the verges and, if you look very carefully, there are Spotted Orchids too.

Swallows are flying overhead in the warm evenings, catching insects, and busy with their nests. They are the ones with the long streamers to their tails, and the House Martins are busy in the eaves of houses, making a terrible mess below their nest; they are white underneath. The Swifts are the ones that scream overhead as they hunt for insects. They are interesting birds as they only land when nesting, the rest of their life being spent on the wing. My children, when told this, had visions of them turning their heads and using their wing as a plate! They sleep on the wing too, using the thermals to keep them high.

Butterflies are cleverer than one might think. Some of the larger ones hibernate over the winter, and it is believed that wood mice eat them. They have several lines of defence. The first is camouflage and, in their hidey-hole, they look just like a leaf. If they are found, apparently, the latest research shows that they start flicking their wings which makes a hissing sound and a series of ultra sonic clicks, which the mice do not like and leave them alone. The eye of the Peacock also deters them. The caterpil-

lars are an important part of the food chain, so please continue to plant Violets, Lavender, Thyme and Buddleia, and leave some Nettles and Wild Garlic for them to eat.

For a walk this month why not go to Thurlbear Common, on the right bevond Henlade; turn down a lane beside the Nag's Head. It is, I think, the nearest place to hear Nightingales. They are drab little birds, like a Robin without a red breast, and prefer to sing from within a thicket, so are difficult to see, but the song is magnifi-



cent.
