# **A CHRISTIAN COUNTRY ?**

Over recent weeks there has been much discussion about whether or not Great Britain can still be described as a "Christian country". The Prime Minister started the ball rolling in his Easter message, when he said "I am proud of the fact that we are a Christian country and we shouldn't be ashamed to say so."

Some people were quick to agree with David Cameron. Perhaps surprisingly, leaders of Hindu and Muslim communities supported the view that we are essentially a Christian country. But others disagreed. Members of the British Humanist Association protested against the idea, calling it narrowminded and divisive. The former Williams Arch-bishop Rowan expressed the view that Britain is now "post-Christian", but he added "that doesn't necessarily mean non-**Opinions** are clearly Christian". divided.

It is undeniably the case that our nation has been massively influenced by the Christian faith. Our legal system has historically been rooted in Christian morality. It was Christians who established many of our important institutions, such as schools, hospitals and charities. Many of our annual celebrations are Christian festivals. Our language has been shaped by the Bible and the prayer book, and there are tens of thousands of churches across the nation.

This powerful Christian heritage leads many people to conclude that being Christian is part and parcel of being British. In the last census, 59% of the British population identified themselves as Christians (even though fewer than 5% go to church regularly). People often say that they are Christians because they were "born in a Christian country", suggesting that their religious faith is little more than an accident of birth that can be taken for granted.



There is, however, a very important difference between being a British citizen and being a Christian. All of us who were born in Great Britain to British parents are automatically British, whether we like it or not. There is no choice or decision to make. Unless we renounce our citizenship, we are British until the day we die. But no-one is born a Christian, even if they are born in a "Christian country" to Christian parents. No-one is automatically a Christian. Being a Christian requires a conscious and deliberate decision or choice.

Jesus Christ calls us to come to him (Matthew 11 v28), to trust in him (John 14 v1), to follow him (Mark 8 v34) and to love him (Luke 10 v27). This makes it very clear that being a Christian is an active response to his word, not an accident of birth or a cultural inheritance.

Around the world, there are many people who do not live in Christian countries but who are Christians and there are many other people who do live in Christian countries but are not Christians. The most important question of all is not whether as a nation we are a Christian country, but whether as individuals we have decided to follow Jesus Christ.

### THE KING'S HEART **IS IN THE HAND OF THE LORD**

Proverbs 21.1, K J V

This Article gives an interesting focus onto what is going on in the Middle East, and is relevant to our current studies in the book of Ecclesiastes.

ajor changes are taking place Within our world today. Relations between and within nations are being transformed. Saudi Arabia, the centre of Wahhabism, has broken its links with Qatar, the centre of the Muslim Brotherhood. The other Gulf States have rejected political Islam and are now isolating any country, such as Qatar, which seeks to propagate it. Turkey is in turmoil. Egypt's new constitution gives full equality to Christians and Jews for the first time.

At the same time appalling conflicts are now raging in places such as the Central African Republic and the Middle Belt and North of Nigeria. The war in Syria continues unabated, but with the difference that Saudi Arabia and the Gulf States have put pressure on Qatar not to send in any rebel forces, nor to fund them, nor to arm them. Momentous changes are in progress as rulers abandon old positions and adopt new ones.

How are we to understand what has happened? How are we to make sense of the changes in our world? The book of Proverbs gives a basic affirmation that the king's heart lies in the hand of God: in other words, that God is the supreme ruler of the universe and this world, that all rulers ultimately owe their authority to Him, that He will ultimately direct the forces of the nations.

As the Church remembers the Ascension of Jesus Christ back to the Father, we need to remember that in Him the prophecy in Daniel 7:14 has been fulfilled: "One like a Son of Man" (i.e. Jesus) was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshipped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed."

The risen Jesus invests His disciples with authority from God. The gates of hell will not prevail against the Church (Matthew 16:18), for Christ is with His Church (Matthew 28:20) and it is the triune God (Matthew 28:19) who will reign. We sing the hymn The Lord is King, a hymn of affirmation. In the midst of the appalling suffering that exists today, emanating from the confusion of authorities and earthly powers, let us be assured that it is our God who reigns over His suffering people and over this world.

### **ANN'S NATURE NOTES**

was reading an article about alien species. As we are now in a world where people move around freely from country to country, this can result in different species settling where they are not native. The Victorian plant hunters started this and they are responsible for some of our horrors. My pet hate is Himalayan Balsam - that pretty pink plant which grows quite tall in the summer on the river banks - and shoots seeds everywhere. The trouble is that it is an annual, with a large leaf, which stops things growing underneath. The results of this are that in the winter the banks are bare, and are liable to erode, and there is no cover for small mammals like water voles. The other plant which is much hated by the railways is the Buddleia. It is a wonderful butterfly bush but it does grow prolifically whenever possible, on poor soil. The nightmare in England is the Japanese Knotweed that has the most enormous and invasive roots. It can creep under houses and cause great trouble, as it is incredibly difficult to eradicate. Not a good idea to have it in your garden - or your neighbour's !!

In the bird world there are the Parakeets noisy, cheerful birds from Africa, which seem to have taken over the South East of England. They are prolific bud eaters which is not good for those who have fruit trees, and they also take over other birds' nests. The classic case of man causing upset to nature is the, usually accidental, introduction of rats to places. New Zealand's ground nesting birds really suffered and the authorities are making a tremendous effort to eradicate them on certain off-shore islands. Ascension Island is doing the same - to save, among others, the Albatrosses which nest there, because the numbers were getting very low. On the Galapagos Islands they are trying to get rid of the feral goats that eat the vegetation and so upset the natural order of things. Hedgehogs were introduced to Uist to reduce the number of snails but what happened was, they took to eating the ground nesting birds' eggs, resulting in a prolific number of verv fat. happy hedgehogs and considerably fewer birds. The introduction of Grey Squirrels to
