QUESTIONS QUESTIONS

Life is full of questions. From very early on in life we start to ask questions. As toddlers, we drive our parents crazy by endlessly asking the simple question, "Why?" When repeated often enough, that question inevitably receives the exasperated answer, "Because I say so!"

As adults we sometimes stop asking questions, or at least we stop asking the questions that really matter to us. We give up on the search for meaning and abandon the attempt to make sense of life, and we try not to think about those searching questions that nag away within us: Who am I? Why do I matter? What is the purpose of my life? What will happen to me when I die?

The reason that we stop asking these kinds of questions may well be that we are not at all confident that we will ever find satisfying answers to them. We choose to live with uncertainty, rather than confronting the most basic questions about our own existence. But it is not easy to live without a clear understanding of what life is all about.



Christians believe that the Bible provides answers to our deepest questions. It does of not answer all our questions, but it tells us all that we need to know in order to make sense of life. It reveals who God is, how we can be at peace with him, and what it means to trust in him. The Bible introduces us to the one person who does have all the answers.

But the Bible also raises some searching questions: Why does a loving God allow suffering? Is there only one way to God? Does science contradict the Bible? These are not easy questions, but we must wrestle with them, if we are to make any sense of life.

We are going to be addressing some of these kinds of questions at our Exe Valley Central services in August. You'll find details of these services on Page 8 in the magazine. Why not come along and join us in exploring some of these searching questions?

ANN'S NATURE NOTES

Recently there has been a lot of talk about the interaction of species. The obvious effects I touched on in the last edition, when an alien is let loose in an area. The latest is the Asian Spined Toad that found its way to Madagascar, last year, probably via a container ship. It has already caused deaths in poultry and other domestic animals plus aquatic and terrestrial plants. Let's hope that it does not cause as many problems as the Cane Toad in Australia. All nature is interdependent. If the Blue

It is remarkable that as the seasons change, the hatching varies with this timing. It would seem that the Spring is getting earlier and the Blue Tits are nesting earlier and the aphids the same. One problem over this balance is, what one does about my pet hate - the slugs and snails. If we kill them, then there is less food for the Song Thrush. I used to say that I had drunken Thrushes when I tried to dispatch the snails by beer/wine traps (dregs I may say) and then throw them away. I thought that there was always a risk that the Thrushes would eat these pickled gastropods and become anebriated !

Another problem of modern farming, of all sorts, is mono-culture. If there are fields of only one crop, anything that does not eat that crop will go elsewhere. Now, with the development of insect repelling crops to improve the yields as there are more human mouths to feed - then there are no insects. This is not so good for insect eating birds like the Skylarks.

The Stewardship programme was good as it kept a variety of flowers/weeds near the hedgerows for food/cover for birds/mammals. The hedgerows were considered the highways for the birds, going from one area to another. Gardens have a variety of flowers, some good for butterflies and some for bees, so keep arowing different things. Try to avoid double varieties because this makes it hard for insects to get to the pollen. It is surprising what a large ecosystem each one of us can create in our gardens. With more area being concreted over, the gardens of England are becoming ever more important for wildlife. It does adapt. As far as Peregrines are concerned humans have created wonderful rock faces for roosting - Cathedrals - which they take



full advantage of, and they have a ready food supply nearby - flocks of pigeons!!

Conclusion - enjoy the world around you but realize that each one of us can make a difference to other species and one hopes for the best. We are all dependant on each other. "No man is an island".

A Good Year for the **Exe Valley Market Bus**

he Exe Valley Market Bus is having a good year! Not only did we receive a very generous grant to buy a new bus at the end of last year - which has popular proved very with our passengers and drivers but, at the recent 2014 Devon County Council Community Transport Awards, our chairman, Colin Radford, won one of six Community Transport Volunteer awards and the Community Transport Volunteer of the Year Award for his many years involvement with the Bus as a driver, driver-trainer, committee member and most recently as chairman as well as managing the treasuring job when it became necessary for a while, AND The Exe Valley Market Bus Service won the 'Best Contribution to the Local Community' Award and £500!

Colin's nomination stated that since the early days he has been a volunteer driver for the regular routes, for the 'First Wednesday' monthly outings and for community hire of the bus and what's more, in his 70's ... he still is! Colin's grounded and common sense approach, together with his natural charm and sense of fun has made for a tightly run voluntary team which has much wider social benefits to the community than just the provision of transport.

The Exe Valley Market Bus Committee are particularly delighted and proud that the nomination for their award came from the Chairs of Oakford,

Stoodleigh, Washfield and Knowstone Parish Councils, reflecting the appreciation of the Bus, and all the volunteers over so many years, in the parishes that it serves.

The nomination said "that for more than 35 years the Exe Valley Market Bus has sustained a vital community bus service for the isolated communities lving between Oakford and Tiverton, providing a link to their market town. The service is recognised as being a mainstay of the local community and is a lifeline for residents without transport, as well as providing social contact. Run, driven and maintained entirely by volunteers, the bus runs twice weekly services to shops, hospital and dentist. There are well supported monthly outings to events and venues in Devon and further afield, organised by the committee and the bus is frequently hired by local groups for personal use, including to visit Exeter Chiefs!

Recently, the committee has extended its service to South Molton and Barnstaple, in conjunction with Knowstone Parish Council in North Devon, increasing passenger numbers, volunteer drivers and support. The new service has enabled several elderly residents of Knowstone to remain in the village.

The bus travels over 10,000 miles a year and thanks to fundraising by the group, donations from community groups and Parish Councils and a substantial grant from DCC, a new bus



has been purchased to replace the previous aging one. However, the dedication and hard work must continue to maintain the service, without which the isolation felt by many residents in this remote part of Devon would be much greater".

The Exe Valley Market Bus is now running its 5th bus since the original Rutex scheme started in 1977 and we hope to continue for many more years and be there for many more passengers in the villages for our scheduled route trips to town as well as the monthly outings and community hire.
