# **AMAZING GRACE**

"Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me". One of our favourite hymns which is not only sung in churches up and down the country but also in secular appearing in the settings, charts from time to time. Yet what is this "Grace" that we sing about? I believe Grace to be one of the most difficult concepts for us to grasp in an age that values individualism, self-sufficiency and empowerment so highly.

The hymn was written at the turn of the 18th Century by John Newton. He was a converted slave trader who was so amazed that, after the way he had messed up in his rough life, he could still be forgiven and restored by the Grace of Jesus. Newton knew he was not good enough for God, but slowly he came to understand that being good enough was not the point. He was saved by God's Grace, the free unmerited forgiveness that is available to each one of us as we put our trust in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Why is this concept of free grace so difficult for us all to take on board? We live in a culture which worships our own achievements.

We are encouraged to take responsibility for our own lives, to seek our own way to the top and, in some areas of sporting, business and political life, to strive to be successful whatever it takes.



Now to some extent this is fine. Yes, we should be confident, and "stand tall" in whatever is our calling in life. But Christians belong to a saviour whose priorities were the opposite to these accepted norms. *"Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he*  was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, ..." writes the Apostle Paul.

Jesus did not grasp His "rights" as we are encouraged to do. No, He was obedient to His Heavenly Father, even to death on the cross.

And it is only at the cross that God's Grace is made possible for us. If we think we have something to contribute to our own salvation, then there is no salvation for us. If we think we are not good enough for God, as Newton did, then that is a great start, and we must accept that this is indeed the position we are in, because none of us is good enough for God. God in His Grace can then come to us in free forgiveness and new birth. As Newton put it "Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me".

There is an additional section on Page 18 giving details of several Charity Events taking place over the next two months. It is heart-warming to know that there is so much support for Charity within the Exe Valley each year and that such incredible amounts of money are raised. One of the Charities mentioned is PSPA. We were not familiar with this, so we looked it up and thought that you may not have heard about it either. It is the Progressive Supranuclear Palsy Association. This incurable degenerative disease involves the gradual deterioration and death of specific volumes of the brain. Some of the resulting side effects include loss of balance, personality changes, visual and speech problems, and difficulty in swallowing. Males and females are affected equally and there is no racial, geographical or occupational link. About 6 people per 100,000 population have PSP.

Due to a clash with Harvest Festivals, there will be no group service in September so, after Loxbeare at the end of August, the next will be at Oakford in October. David Beasley from The Leprosy Mission will be the guest speaker at the November service – more details in due course.

## **NATURE NOTES**

he long, late summer evenings provide an ideal opportunity for a walk and the chance to catch Nature's wildlife unaware. I do not know if they drop their defences somewhat but it is not uncommon for me to stumble across a deer or a buzzard and it is hard to know, between observer and observed, who is the most startled. Certainly you never cease to be amazed by the size of these creatures when you are a few yards from them and they crash away. Like all such encounters you wish they lasted longer and that you had an action replay button available.

Indeed my only encounters with Barn Owls have occurred at this time, when harvest and the lure of food have enabled even a casual observer to see these ghostly and silent apparitions as they drift above the landscape. They are at no great height and they ignore the fact that darkness has not fallen and the presence of Combine Harvesters, which even to a man sized

animal with limited imagination could be mistaken as a machine from Hell. I can only imagine the sights that farm workers of old enjoyed as they harvested in the cool of the evening, trouser legs tied with bootlaces against the emergency exit of field creatures and the skies filled with hunting extras from Harry Potter. As darkness drops, the progress of all night hunters like owls, badgers, bats and otters seems to become less sinister and watching them as they continue their prowl is a more peaceful and less charged occupation. Even the lights of a distant Combined Harvester moving in flurry of dust become less threatening and I begin to wonder if I am in Britain or witnessing an American movie.

As I wander in the dusk I often wonder why animals are so scared of my walking figure. During the day I know hinds have long since been aware of my presence and a line of wing nuts face me long before my gaze has fallen on them. Although this is less so in the evening I have never understood why all animals see me as such a threat whilst they look at the noisome and dangerous motor car with such impunity. Thankfully their progress across our lane never meets with disaster and I am amazed at the number and age of scrapes, furrows and runs that disfigure the lane side banks, in such constant use that a night-time congestion charge may be warranted.

### THE EXETER POUND

Plans are progressing well to introduce an exciting new complementary currency in Exeter later this summer. The Exeter Pound (£EP) will be launched with a Community Market in Cathedral Close on 1 September. The currency will then be operational and tradable at a number of outlets in the city, especially local independent shops and cafes.

The project is supported by Exeter City Council, local businesses, Exeter Chiefs Rugby Club, Exeter City Football Club, Exeter Cathedral and various community and voluntary organisations.

The main advantages of the Exeter Pound are likely to be stronger support for Exeter firms, emphasising business loyalty, greater benefit to the local economy, prompting a stronger sense of city and community identity, and promoting an improved environment in the longer term.

From a perspective of faith, the scheme will also encourage community building, economic justice and build better relationships of trust locally (for more details on this see the attachment below).

This is a great way to further support to the local community by trading in the  $\pounds EP$  - which may well end up in collection plates and charitable donations!

There will be four denominations – &EP 1, &EP 5, &EP 10 and &EP 20, with a special commemorative &EP 15 note being printed for the World Cup Rugby.
