# IMMANUEL ~ "GOD WITH US"

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests."

What a rush. Shopping, presents, then there's the tree, the decorations, the cards to write, the pudding to make, the turkey to cook & then there's .....

We all know the feeling - this mid-winter festival causes so much stress, apparently Christmas is the prime time for family friction. But if the Christmas cards are to be believed, this is meant to be the season of peace & goodwill - the celebration of the birth of the Prince of Peace!

We must ask - was it meant to be like this? It was intended to be something rather different. The Gospel writers showed little interest in the exact date of Jesus' birth. It was not until the 3rd Century that the matter was debated, various dates being championed such as 15 January, 10 June and 2 February.

No, what the Bible writers were interested in, was the meaning of Jesus' birth. Much had been prophesied centuries before; the Virgin birth prophesied by Isaiah, the birth at Bethlehem prophesied by Micah, and that God Himself, Immanuel, would come to us - Isaiah.

Just as the rush and business of our festival is not envisaged in the Bible, neither is much of the romance and sentimentality that surrounds it. The Gospel writers are concerned with the reality and the implications of Christ's coming.



And the facts are not always pleasant. The Roman census took no account of Marv's advanced pregnancy, she had to Nazareth travel from to Bethlehem, presumably on foot but just possibly by donkey, a distance of about 100 miles. Then Jesus' birth led to the massacre of all the children under 2 in Bethlehem because of King Herod's famous paranoia about being deposed, so Jesus' family became refugees in Egypt. Despite all this, peace was announced to God's people by

the angels, as they appeared to the despised shepherds. And Jesus is the Prince of Peace to those who come to Him for forgiveness and new life. He has come to bring human beings peace with each other as they find their peace with God.

Christmas is indeed about Immanuel, "God with us", in our homes, in our villages, in our churches, but at a great cost. We must remember that one of the Magi's gifts was myrrh - the stuff of burial! Also that the aged prophet Simeon warned Mary that "a sword will pierce your own heart". Jesus' purpose in coming, was to die as a sacrifice for each of us.

As we open wide our churches to welcome all who come to the Carol Services and Christmas celebrations and as we quite rightly wish each other a peaceful and joyful Christmas, let us remember what it cost the Lord Jesus to come to this earth to save us. Immanuel - God with us - at so great a cost but oh! in such great love.

May you all have a very blessed and peaceful Christmas.

## **BILLY GRAHAM INTERVIEW**

Whilst we miaht want to make some allowance for the American idiom in which it is expressed, it seems to me to say something important for all Churches in this country, not least the Exe Valley. I know I for one have been guilty of being critical of our ministers at times. John Roberts

## **Question**

Why do some people seem to enjoy criticizing their pastor? I'm in a civic organization with a couple of friends from another church, and it seems like all they talk about is their pastor's shortcomings. Should I say something to them about this?

## **Billy Graham Answer**

No pastor is perfect, of course - but if God has called someone to be a pastor and has sent them to serve a particular church, then they should be helped and encouraged in every way possible. The Bible says, "Who can lay a hand on the Lord's anointed and be guiltless?" (1 Samuel 26:9). Does this mean pastors should always be above criticism - even if they neglect their responsibilities or otherwise are at fault? No, it doesn't - but most churches have ways of dealing with such matters through their ruling board or denominational structure. Paul reminded the Christians in Corinth that "everything should be done in a fitting and orderly way" (1 Corinthians 14:40).

Sadly, I have known of church members who seem to enjoy criticizing their pastor - and sometimes they keep doing it pastor after pastor. I've never known why; perhaps they do it just to get attention. But whatever their reason, it is wrong, and it is a sin in the eyes of God. Not only does it cause dissension in the church, but it means their heart and mind are closed to the teaching of God's Word.

Pray for an opportunity to speak with your friends about their attitude, urging them not only to avoid criticizing their pastor but to do all they can to support and help this individual. Especially encourage them to pray for their pastor. Pray too for your own church and its pastoral staff, that they truly may "Be shepherds of God's flock ... eager to serve" (1 Peter 5:2).

# NATURE NOTES

s we approach the depths of Winter A and the festive time, tradition dictates that we invite nature into our homes by cutting and displaying all types of greenery. Even those wedded to glass, steel and concrete, value the notion of nature and life outside, as represented by these decorative takeaways. It is not just the visually festive effect on our rooms but also the subtle smell that invades the home, evoking memories of Christmas past and jealousy from air freshener manufacturers.

Honourina nature when it has apparently gone to sleep, dates back to pagan times and it is said that our St. Boniface was particularly incensed by a group of people praising an oak tree in a forest. Some say that the Saint cut down the tree and the people, who were instantly converted, adopted the replacement fir in ensuing commemorative events and hence today's traditions.

This happened in a German forest and it is amazing how traditions and customs spread whilst others, concerning natural elements, remain very much 'home grown'. Almost uniquely in Devon is the ritual of the ashen faggot which was a source of merriment and good cheer whilst also keeping the Devil and all his works at bav.

The faggot was a bundle of ash twigs and sticks which were bound with several withies [flexible stalks of green ash].

Dilates

Unmarried girls would choose a withy and the first that burnt and exploded was indicative of the next likely marriage. In every case each bursting withy was carefully monitored and toasted with a drink.

The most fascinating tradition though, must be that concerning the mysterious mistletoe [Viscum album]. I would suggest not everything is understood about this parasite with the extraordinary starting observation that its growth on bare branches [only] is mostly confined, in the UK, to the counties of Worcester, Hereford, Gloucester and Somerset. There are many fine patches by the approach roads to Taunton which can be admired in Winter, whilst waiting for the traffic to move. Again there is much confusion over which host tree it favours, with apple and lime being the most consistently quoted.

In terms of decoration and tradition, the sprigs were originally mounted as part of a much larger ball of greenery together with holly, rosemary and ivy. These were wrapped around two hoops to form an open sphere but the mistletoe was always at the base of the kissing bough and within reach.

I would remind those trying to steal a kiss today that they should, if successful, remove one of the berries. I would also encourage them to try to propagate them in the Exe Valley as it does not seem to harm the host and when in oak trees is said to be particularly fortuitous.

# LARC Arising !!

You may not have heard of LARC – Library And Resource Centre- but it's coming to Bampton next year! So what is it about? Bampton's much loved Library is under threat of closure by Devon County Council. It's a very small building and can't support the

facilities that DCC want to provide via its library service. Unless it can be relocated to larger premises and become more sustainable, it will close. Bad news for Bampton and the surrounding villages! (The library is **still open** for business as usual).

An action group was set up in August 2014 to fight the closure. That action group has developed into LARCS-Supporters - as not only did residents want the library to continue, but also identified lots of other services that they would like to see, via a Resource Centre. Ideas include a youth meeting place, IT classes, 'pop-up' shops for police, Age UK, and CAB, art and craft classes, toddlers group, talks and author events.

So what's happened so far? We have identified a building opposite the main car park in Bampton, originally the primary school - have a look at the posters on the shutter next time you're in Bampton- which has enough space to rehouse the library and provide other facilities that residents identified. The building is sound but needs a new roof and complete refurbishment inside. Once completed it will provide easy access, a toilet with disabled access, and a small kitchen for that important cup of tea while browsing books or partaking in activities. We have already received generous funds from local councils and individuals, but we need a 'big' grant for the bulk of the work, which we are in the process of applying for.

Bampton is the 'local' centre for many neiahbourina villages, including Oakford and Stoodleigh, and these extra community facilities, plus the library with extended opening hours, will help to overcome the isolation that often comes with living in our idyllic, but rural villages. We appreciate that travel into Bampton from Oakford and Stoodleigh isn't easy for everyone, and we would welcome any suggestions as to how we could provide transport to visit the library, and any other services we could offer. Of course we welcome residents from any of the Exe Valley villages, to use the shops or the excellent hostelries, and the new library in the future, but we appreciate the extra travelling involved and the convenience of being nearer to Tiverton.

And you can keep up to date via the Bampton Town Web site (www.bampton.org.uk/library) or Facebook (Bampton Library And Resource Centre) - and finally, if you are able to offer help in any way, we would be delighted to hear from you!
