# **BREXIT AND ALL THAT !!**

With the referendum result leaving a policy vacuum, it seemed that the whole establishment of the country was in turmoil. I imagine we were all disappointed by the tone of both referendum campaigns and the way they were conducted. Things are now settling down somewhat; we have a new Prime Minister whilst the Labour party is organising its own leadership vote.

## WELCOME THE FOREIGNER

Christians must be appalled by reports of increased hate crime, racism and xenophobia, sadly so exemplified by the cruel arson attack upon a Polish family here in Devon. The concern of many in our society about unrestricted immigration is understandable, but in no way can we allow ourselves to regard those from other lands with fear and distrust. We must not let that happen.

A key virtue in Biblical Christianity is hospitality, we are all naturally exiled from God until accepted into His family by Jesus. We read (Ephesians 2. 19), *"you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household."* 

In turn we must demonstrate hospitality; in Hebrews 13. 2 we read "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it." The Old Testament is even clearer. Here's Leviticus 19:34: "You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love them as yourself. I the Lord God" am vour Regardless of what migration policies we have, there will always be foreigners amongst us. The Christian attitude is that we are to welcome strangers, and be hospitable.



The only certainty is uncertainty. Uncertainties remain - we have had a vacuum of leadership and no one is quite clear how the pieces will fall. It's tempting to panic. Instead we must pray. Pray especially for wisdom for all the policy and decision makers who have a long few years ahead of them.

## SOVEREIGNTY

For manv of those who supported Brexit, 23 June is seen as "Independence Day". Many have been thinking and talking of this decision as being about restoring our national sovereignty. However, we must remember national all sovereignty depends upon the ultimate and unauestioned sovereignty of God the Father, and of his Son Jesus: for all authority in heaven and earth has been given to Him (Matthew 28:18), and our leaders are ultimately answerable to Him as, indeed, is each one of us.

We Christians must not put our hopes for the well-being of society either on our independence from Europe or on our relationship with Europe. The well-being of our society all hangs on our relationship with the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Let us make sure that our hope is set on Jesus and all pray for our leaders.

# **NATURE NOTES**

he experts say that this Spring was cold and delayed. My perception is that it was full of lovely, mostly dry days, which gave way to a very promising early Summer. I seemed to be bombarded with the smells and sounds of Nature which have left a lasting impression. Knightshaves was encased in a dome of scent from apple and rhododendron blossom. In the unusually dry weather and easterly or northerly air streams, we noted these fragrances, when we probably have never done so before. It was odd to be enticed out to smell the land and the countryside whenever the humidity changed, whether from the



drying dew or a small burst of passing mizzle.

During one expedition I met a lady harvesting wild garlic into a series of plastic carrier bags. I sincerely hope she was not intending to return home by bus, though she would surely have got a seat. Perhaps she had been reading old books which may have referred to the plants as wild Ransom and in which it may be suggested that the addition of garlic to the soil enhances the scent of roses.

The sounds of nature have been mostly that of birds and almost continuous, but that is not to discount the restful babble of the stream nor the gentle buzzing of many types of bees. I would have said that entry into a quiet woodland provided a pleasing contrast but our local juvenile greater spotted woodpecker has developed a pecking frequency that sounds as if the old oak tree is creaking and about to fall.

As we approach high Summer nature provides the smell of sea, fish and seaweed and the sound of rolling waves, with the lonely cries of gulls to impress generations of holiday makers. In my memories of childhood holidays, the call of gulls in the evening is intermingled with those of rooks as they sign off another sunny and satisfactory day. Distance lends enchantment to both these sounds and a rookery at roosting time is a turbulent and noisy place. Each night every bird seems to want to tell of the day's events, but none wish to listen and regular rows result. Pity the poor rook wishing for an early night !! Many must dream of becoming a solitary crow.
