FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago

### February and March, 1967

When I penned the article for the October / November 2016 issue, I mentioned that the Exe Valley in 1966, parishes comprised seven Calverleigh, Morebath. Oakford. Rackenford, Stoodleigh, Washfield and Withleigh. By February, Loxbeare and Templeton had been added to the collection. Cruwys Morchard, where were you???

Thirty-seven young people were confirmed by the Bishop of Exeter at a service at Stoodleigh on the 21st February.

Church heating systems seem to have with been an issue, Oakford. Rackenford and Templeton having had new systems installed. Ironically, the winter appears to have been unseasonably mild, with the question being asked, "Are we going to have any real winter?"

Replying to questions about their longrange forecast, which had told us that January would find us in the grip of snow and ice, the weather men were reported to have said, "This did not out to be one of our more turn successful predictions"!!!

In Washfield, a resolution had been passed to demolish the wall and reduce the level of the old school playground to road level, to create a village square. The Memorial Hall was also to be extended, using volunteer labour.

### **NATURE NOTES**

It is good to have a return of cold bright winters. You feel a prolonged cold snap is good for the land, and Nature becomes more observable than in the dark damp days, when all seems to quietly take cover. When the brightness has been interrupted by mists and fog, rewarding and haunting views in the valleys have resulted. However, in the main, days of sparkling clarity demand that you look or go outside [flu permitting] to take in the wide and distant panoramas. In this still, colour drained and denuded environment, the animals rightly feel very conspicuous. The buzzard fidgets uncomfortably on its normal lookouts and will shortly leave. The pheasant on its favourite roost tries to merge with the branch and hopes the darkness of early nightfall makes further movement unnecessary.

Careful entry into woodland is often greeted with a start and a scamper. The glorious red of the fox and male pheasant must be an embarrassment in this moment. The dull deer have less to display save for the flash of a white behind to interest only crossword compilers. Nearer to home both male and female robins show no such shyness - each revelling in the same 'redbreastness'. Even in the coldest snap they alone continue to sing. Their territorial possessiveness is for all seasons and will supposedly descend to murder but I have not witnessed scenes of undue aggressiveness. Perhaps the Exe Valley robin feels less threatened, as all put food out.

The grey and brown mass of the deciduous woodlands are reminiscent of the morning porridge, if left unstirred

on the breakfast table. No doubt artists with a definitive eye could make more of the tinge of purple [in the trees of course]. The same trees, if alone and dotted across the upland, lose little of their majesty despite being leafless and colourless.

I challenge myself to identify each whilst still hundreds of yards away. I recommend this to all, as it demands you really look at both the overall form and pattern of the branches. You are then compelled to inspect the bark and buds of the tree, when you get nearer. I would avoid the feeling of an app coming on.

This influenced both his conversation and his prayer-life.

In recent years, since 1994 he and Wendy have lived at Combe Water and, except when the weather has made it impossible, have loyally worshipped at St Peter's Oakford, Sunday by Sunday, and made the church their second home. His weekly Saturday visits to set up the heating and prepare the altar made it possible for visiting clergy to feel instantly at home and to feel we belonged – a great gift to us roving ministers.

Last autumn I stood in for Mike at the auction of harvest produce in the village hall. An exhausting two hours



acting as auctioneer dragging out the cash for charities and entertaining the diners. Mike has performed this role for many years but was pleased to give it a rest and, with his health problems, it was wonderful that he was still able to organise this event. His contribution to the life of Oakford has been considerable and he will be sadly missed and I shall miss his friendly, if at times a little sarcastic, welcome Sunday by Sunday.
