love the summer. I love the sun and the heat, when we have it. And we have had quite a bit of it lately. The only trouble with it is, that there are certain parts of my anatomy, that for most of the year remain discreetly under wraps, but then are exposed, when the sun comes out. Take the tops of my arms for example. Or bare legs. Or - dare I say it? - my feet! Fond though I am of them, and useful though they are, I have never thought of my feet as being one of my more attractive features. In fact, quite the opposite. FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago August and September, 1967

he Editorial for this issue looked positively what. at then. comprised the Exe Valley Group of nine parishes, three years after it came into being. Though including Morebath, but still no sign of Cruwys Morchard! - "... there is abundant evidence that the nine-partnersmarriage has worked". Ours was the first 'grouping' within the Diocese of Exeter, initially experimentally, but the proposal to make it a legal entity led to severe criticism of the 'Right of Patronage'. At one time Patronage could, literally, be bought and sold by individuals and societies, and could result in individuals who had no connection or genuine interest in a Parish, or its people, being able to influence the choice of clergy, and the churchmanship of the Parish.

Patrons didn't even have to be members of the Church of England! "So it is, then, that although the Bishop and our own church officers – wardens and PCC members – wish to secure the East Devon (?) Group, a couple of men who live hundreds of miles away are trying to wreck it. What do they care about Church Fêtes and Holidays at Home? If our children never have the chance to join a youth club; if congregations are small and clergy disheartened, they are not here, to see or care."

On a brighter note, 'Holidays at Home' had brought together more than 200 youngsters, and 100 teenagers in the evenings. The Youth Club regularly attracted 60 members each week to Washfield, from September to April, and three minibuses were collecting children for Sunday School each week.

Washfield's B.G. wrote, bemoaning the regular appearance of salesmen proffering religious literature, and reluctant to take "no" for an answer. Cold calling is, clearly, nothing new!

M.H.A. wrote about children's attitudes to Nursery Rhymes, and quoting a couple of 'unauthorised versions', which may well be familiar to some:-

"...There came a big spider who drank all the cider, and so the poor dog had none".

"Mary had a little lamb, her father shot it dead, and now it goes to school with her between two chunks of bread"!

Oakford had plans to hold an Autumn Fair. Following a successful outing to Teignmouth, Washfield were planning a coach trip to Plymouth – at a cost of 10/- (50p) for adults! Loxbeare had just held its first Fête for thirteen years.

Watching the Natural World on television causes wonder but feels like escapism. Seeing the real thing close to home during a long leisurely Summer is quite different

and engenders a feeling of well being. It started on an evening in apple blossom time when the pollinating insects made me stop and watch. I presume others have experienced the calmness this induces. The gentle and low hum of activity is less hectic than later in the year, and the promise of things to come or perhaps the pleasure of watching others work induces a feeling of peace.

We also have a short-tailed vole that emerges from the field up a surface drain from the patio, to keep us amused. It has a run along the edge of the patio and its destination is a long-spent clump of aubrietia. It neatly snips off a bunch and exactly retraces its steps. It dodges from pot to pot on its journey, but though very furtive, is hardly an expert at concealment. Indeed when it discovered a shard of coriander that had escaped between herb pot and kitchen, he or she trembled and could not contain their excitement. A modern Wind in the Willows would have Ratty's cousin enjoying a curry whilst resting on a bed of dried aubrietia.

The slow spiraling of buzzards is a restful sight but this year attention has often been spoilt by flapping and belligerent blackbirds. An escape to the coast for cooler breezes allows the graceful flight of birds to be watched with less interruption. The larger birds glide with no sense of effort but, as a contrast, I find oystercatchers particularly compelling to watch. Squadrons fly in tight formation across the bay along the edge of the waves with a great sense of urgency and purpose. Quite why and how they decide to land is a mystery and their flying prowess

seems to be wasted given their target - usually shellfish, over which they have total mastery whether to open or to eat. Their flight path intersects that of wet-suited surfers and, at a distance, both share the same dress code – black and white with a flash of red.
