Every single thing has been gratefully received and eaten. Thank you. And thank you to all the wonderful people who take the time and energy to grow such things and to those who work the land, especially here, in the Exe Valley.



Thank you also, to those in our Churches and Villages who keep the tradition of Harvest alive. Thank you to those who not only arrange Harvest Festivals, but also village games and Harvest Suppers. Thank you.

Then, as we come to November we enter another season of thankfulness, as we remember, those who have fought and died in conflict. It is worth stopping awhile (even if only for two minutes) to remember the

tremendous human cost and sacrifice of men and women in the last century or so, who have fought for our freedom. Another poet, (not Simon Armitage, but Siegfried Sassoon) who in his evocative 'Autumn' poem, imagines soldiers. the fighting in a wood, in October, during World War 1:

'Their lives are like the leaves Scattered in flocks of ruin, tossed and blown Along the westering furnace flaring red.'

And so let us say thank you – and be grateful that we have seasons and occasions that prompt us to do so, because:

'All good gifts around us (our food, our families, our friends, our freedom) Are sent from heaven above. Then thank the Lord, Oh thank the Lord, For all his love.'

FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago October & November, 1967

The Editorials spoke strongly about the decline in morals, and the Church's failure to speak out on Biblical principles when faced with secular pressures, particularly in relation to the laws on homosexuality which came into force in 1967 and the suggestion that co-habiting before considering marriage was the way forward. I wonder how our Group Rector of the time would view the current outlook in relation to such matters?

In the Exe Valley, thoughts were very much concerned with Harvest, some Parishes reporting their festival activities, while others were yet to come. Autumn Fairs/Fayres were also being organised. The higher attendance levels at Harvest Festival Services in those days is highlighted by Rackenford's PCC asking parishioners to reserve seats! For its Autumn Fayre, Withleigh was hoping to boost the spending by providing a free bus from Tiverton.

Repairs to Church buildings were an issue – Stoodleigh embarking on work to the east wall, and Templeton to the tower, of which the top six feet was in need of rebuilding.

Sunday Schools were being held in six of our Parishes, with transport provided. Interestingly, only three of our parishes – Oakford, Rackenford and Templeton were holding Remembrance Services.

NATURE NOTES

am in the habit of leaving my work boots outside the back door so that they might dry and de-fumigate !! You may think the shed would be a better place, but so do the mice that like "sole and tongue" on their evening menu.

Imagine my surprise one August morning when my left foot met a squidgy resistance whilst putting the boot on. With some trepidation I looked into the boot and found our back door toad [as opposed to the back of the garage toad] staring at me.

This was my third amphibian encounter of the year- my first being in Spring when my spade missed a frog that was resting or perhaps hibernating in mud at a surprising depth. With a little thought it is relatively easy to distinguish between a toad and a frog. In terms of the latter I often think - green, wetter and hopping with water usually in the visible if not immediate vicinity. Toads, and especially our back door toad, seem to be very phlegmatic characters and we spend much time staring at each other to see who will blink first. Their back leas are short and not equipped to hop but you get a feeling that they would consider this both undignified and too much effort.

My second encounter [in Midsummer] was much livelier, involving a plague of tiny frogs on the lawn. The dry spell had just broken and I wandered out in the evening to find they had left their water courses to frolic in the dew dropped grass. I was immediately transported to childhood visits to my grandmother. She lived in a terrace house, and the row was unusually blessed with tiny, walled front gardens. Necessarily the gardens had piped drains through the walls, such that after Summer rainfall a cascade of small frogs would spill across the pavement. Imagine the effect on young children of seeing these streaks, alive with movement, across the pavement as far as the eye could see.

In case you are wondering, our back door toad is well, and despite putting it carefully in the field it immediately returned to sentry duty that very night. We can only conclude that they are territorial - and have no sense of smell !!
