It's a song of my childhood, sung sitting round the dining table, knife and fork in hand, fists lightly drumming against the table in time with the music, while my mother slaved away in the kitchen.

My dad and I thought it was very, very funny. I suspect my mother did not.

And today, for some strange and unexpected reason, I have found myself wondering why I ever found it so amusing, and – more important, why *are* we waiting?'

You see, I'm hopeless at it. I hate waiting. I want to have everything now, this minute. And of course, generally speaking, that's exactly what I do. Because I can! And I am not alone. In our present

culture, waiting is something of an anathema. We can get what we want straight away. We don't even have to go to the shops. We can buy stuff, and it arrives the next day. Then, the day after, we can send it back again! It's as though there is nothing really worth waiting for. Text messages and e-mails need be answered straightto away. Phone calls can be made from the most inaccessible places. Clearly, the Exe Valley is an exception to this!



Advent is all about waiting. It's not about getting ready or being prepared, or filling up the time in readiness for 'the big event'. Neither is it about doing nothing. Waiting is about spending time in the present. It is not allowing ourselves to be influenced by the demands of the future, but taking time to 'be'. Advent offers us the opportunity allow to ourselves to be transformed by the presence of God. I will be at the various Advent Reflections across the Mission Community. Each one will be different, so feel free to come and join me for however many you can. If we spend a bit of time, amid all the busyness, and wait, I suspect that we might then come to the place where the tune remains the same, but the words change. Instead of 'Why are we waiting?' we might find ourselves singing, 'O come let us adore Him, Christ the Lord.'

I look forward to seeing you over the next few weeks as we celebrate Christmas together, and welcome in the New Year, with all that it holds.

### **FROM THE ARCHIVES**

### **'TODAY' 50 years ago** December 1967 & January 1968

December had traditionally been known as "Slaughter month", when farmers were obliged to kill the livestock for which they would be unable to provide feed during the Winter.

Clergy were clearly in abundance, with six of the nine parishes each having three services over Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, the other three parishes having to make do with two!

In a re-telling of the Christmas story, when Mary and Joseph visited the Temple following the birth of Jesus, they were required to present two purple doves or two pigeons!

The Rector was seeking volunteers to help children who were having difficulty with their reading.

"Church sheep" were kept by farmers in more than one parish. Presumably the sale of the sheep raised funds for the churches?

Loxbeare's organ had been restored.

There was concern at Oakford school over fallen plaster and exposed rot to timbers.

Christmas trees were being offered for sale at 1/9d (about 8p!) per foot, up to 3'-6" tall – including delivery!

Rackenford's young people presented the Christmas Eve Carol Service.

The Templeton Country Sale, held in Tiverton, raised £105 towards the £1,000

cost of tower repairs. Manure was on offer at 3/- (15p) a sack, as a fund-raising initiative, and had made it into the national press! The cost of restoration of the bells was not going to be as much as originally thought.

The Withleigh Autumn Fayre had raised  $\pounds$ 91, effectively clearing the  $\pounds$ 750 debt from the major restoration and rebuilding work to the church.

Foot and Mouth was taking its toll on events, with carol singing cancelled, Stoodleigh's Christmas Fair being postponed and the Washfield children's party in doubt. Pathfinders and some Sunday Schools were also victims.

A cold February was predicted, with heavy snowfalls.
