STEPH REFLEXE ...

Well, I came back from holiday looking forward to catching up with watching some programmes on iplayer. Husband was out, so it was a perfect opportunity for me to settle down and watch, 'Call the Mid-Wife', one of my favourites, and a programme my husband likes to avoid. A perfect hour of relaxing viewing, before returning to work.

But no! I was wrong!

There was nothing relaxing about it, at all! It was devastating! The story-line was not what I was expecting. And neither was the outcome. I felt completely wrung out by the end. I was emotionally drained. I rather regretted watching it in the first place.

And of course, on reflection, I realise that life is full of the unexpected. Everything seems to be going along swimmingly. The sun is shining. The sky is blue. Spring is on the way and all is great with the world. And then suddenly, wham! bang! something happens, something devastating comes from nowhere and the sun may still be shining, but you can't see it any more, because everything has turned dark and black.

That's exactly what happened in this episode of, 'Call the Mid-Wife'. And yet in the midst of a deep, tragic, personal disaster, words of comfort and hope were uttered:

'The Lord is my Shepherd, he is everything I need ... Even though I walk through the Valley of the Shadow of Death I will fear no evil ... Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.' **FROM THE ARCHIVES**

'TODAY' 50 years ago

April and May, 1968

The magazine was still "not back to normal" but it was hoped that the situation would be normal by the end of April.

The Resurrection, as the basis of the Christian faith, constituted the lead article in the April magazine, particularly in relation to those, including churchmen, who refused to accept it because it could not be proven by "reason". If you cannot accept the Resurrection, then Christianity is no faith at all.

Rev. Christopher Tull was promoting the idea of weekly offering envelopes as a means of reducing the gap between a Church's (with Withleigh in mind) income and its outgoings.

Mothering Sunday had seen a wellattended Group Service at Stoodleigh. [Seems ironic that our churches all expect their own Service despite our resident clergy numbers being greatly depleted, but then, lay service leaders was still something for the future].

In Templeton, the 'boys' had organised a successful dance in aid of the Church tower repair fund.

Clearly never one to shy away from controversy, Rev. Herniman's lead article, in the May issue, took on the housing shortage, and the way this had been exacerbated by immigration. It was not just about housing, but the number of available teachers, doctors, and jobs generally. [Looks like nothing has changed in fifty years!]. Rev. Richard Steele-Perkins, left the Exe Valley after nearly three years of service, with special responsibilities for Loxbeare and Rackenford.

In January, Washfield had lost its Post Office and, during April, Templeton P.O. had also closed. Stamps could, however, be bought directly from the postman!

A 'flu epidemic had hit most of the families in Oakford.

Withleigh 'A' team (Caroline Langworthy, Janet Roberts and Jonathan Langworthy) was narrowly defeated by Exmouth in the final of Criss-cross Quiz.
