FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago October and November, 1968

Thanks were recorded for the generous giving within the parishes – eight of the (then) nine parish churches now had new heating systems.

In the Washfield Post, the youth club had run into money difficulties. Washfield School was suffering severely from dry rot, and it was felt there was no option but to dispose of the building.

A Group Committee had come into being, to deal with Group matters, including finances. The Exe Valley Group was the first Group ministry in the whole of the Exeter Diocese.

At Withleigh, Percy Crook had retired as Sexton – the third generation of his family, and the only ones to hold the post since the building of the church in 1846. It was hoped that the choir would have their robes by Christmas. A Country Market was also being planned.

Loxbeare ladies broke a record with their September Country Stall, raising $\pounds 37$ for the church fabric fund. A whist drive and draw had raised $\pounds 114$ towards the new heating system.

The lead article in the November issue ran to no less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ pages on the rights and wrongs of factory farming and animal welfare.

At Stoodleigh, the future of the Cottages was safe. Dryhill Turkeys for Christmas would be on sale at 5/6 ($27\frac{1}{2}p$) a pound (up to 15lbs) and 4/6 ($22\frac{1}{2}p$) a pound for larger.

Templeton had jams, marmalade and chutneys on sale at 1/6 (7½p) a pound, in aid of church funds and they were also planning a Christmas Country Market, to be held in Tiverton. Thanks were expressed to the boys who had organised dances to raise money for the Tower Fund. A village hall committee was proposed to deal with the provision of a new hall.

An article on the relevance, or otherwise, of Remembrance Day, and whether or not it glorified war, concluded that "....we should continue to honour all who have died in the service of their country with thanksgiving; that also we resolve with God's help to improve this troubled world which we have inherited; and to rededicate ourselves to service to our community and nation."

NATURE NOTES

t is self evident that when you live in the countryside you are closer to Nature. What may not be as clear to City dwellers is that all your senses become heightened and you actually feel part of Nature. Not least in this shared experience, is the enhanced awareness of the weather. It would not be uncommon for an urban dweller, if they escape to the countryside or a park at the weekend, to be surprised at how wet and heavy the ground is. They and the town will have forgotten that there was any rain during the week.

We have been acutely aware of the weather this last year. The harsh Winter and the snow provided lovely silent landscapes in which the colours of the fox and pheasant showed up as never before. Traffic and radio reports indicated that we were hardly less vulnerable than the rest of Nature but for first-time sledgers it was Winter to remember. There then followed the period of the 'Grand Wet' and it felt like three months. Seeds could not be planted, no animals could be turned out and the only sense energised was that of depression - save for the brave snowdrops and primroses. Other bulbs seemed to know better, as if the glorious summer was expected.

However, those plants not lost in Winter had to face desperate difficulties in Summer and farmers watched the abundant grass disappear, along with their cereal yield and feedstocks. Nevertheless, it was a miracle how green the trees remained and the people of Devon should be grateful of how much of this previously captured water found its way back to the parched land. 'Treeless' Cornwall, by contrast, was brown and even the golf greens were not 'green'. In this period I was overwhelmed with the smell of the lime trees and for once, urban dwellers risked breathing deeply whole streets in some towns were drenched in the perfume, thanks to the stillness and the heat. Nature and the land breathed a sigh of relief when the drought was broken and our senses were given an ancient word to remember - petrichor – the pleasant smell of dry ground after the first rain.

During my placement with the Exe Valley Mission Community I have learned so much, that it's hard to know where to start.
