## **'TODAY' 50 years ago** October and November, 1968

The December lead article focussed on the subject of the cost of Christmas Cards and a recent increase on postal rates. It was also suggested that we 'overdo' the number of cards we send, especially when we include people we see regularly.

Children's Christmas parties were to take place at Oakford, Washfield and Withleigh.

New Year's parties were to be held at Calverleigh.

Loxbeare's yew tree, which was causing problems to the tower, was to be felled in January.

Rackenford football club members were holding a dance to raise money for new kit. The Young Anglicans had decorated the Church, and led the candle-lit Carol Service

Stoodleigh were asking the question, "How badly do you want the youth club to re-open?" The Group Christingle Service was to be held on the afternoon of the Sunday after Christmas at Stoodleigh.

Templeton's Country Market, at Tiverton, raised 76.

At Washfield, a public meeting was to be held to discuss the future of the old school building.

Withleigh Choir wore their new robes for the first time at the Carol Service, but not just at Withleigh's, but also at Templeton's Service on the same day.

here is one war in which a truce is never called and that is between many friends of ours and grey squirrels. The appearance of a squirrel, changes their otherwise mild manner and only politeness prevents them from renewing hostilities there and then. I do not think it is revenge on behalf of the red squirrels or even to protect the bird food, it is just that squirrels are so shameless, and it is hard to fight the feeling of wanting to wring their necks without hurting them. However, you cannot help but be amused as they hurry away with yet another acorn for their Winter store. This is when they look their most furtive and guilty, worried that it might be stolen, and presumably anxious that you do not follow them to their hiding place. Like front door keys, it will predictably be the most convenient plant pot and the buried bulbs which will be sacrificed in next year's frantic search.

Human foraging of Nature's gifts should be less destructive but carries a similar frisson with the anticipation of decorating a future feast or drink with colour and memories. Some of the finds are an oddity and as per the oft repeated phrase of there being 'a very brave man who first ate an oyster' the same could be extended to those who started to eat fungi. Unfortunately gourmets and chefs have taken this to another level and a six figure sum for a truffle is not unheard of. Similarly in further search for the exotic, trendy chefs even buy from urban foragers in London. Pineapple weed, the current fashion, is finding its way into cocktails but one is tempted to suggest to the forager that they should just cultivate borage. I would also like to inform those in the Exe Valley, who desperately looked for sloes for their festive fare, that they should go to Cornwall next year. The blackthorn trees there are numerous and

stunted by the wind, and make for easy picking. Please do not use damsons instead as it is not foraging and such fruit is too good to end its life soaked in gin. [no obvious comments please]

Here is Lavla Hill's South African Adventure - she writes : My favourite moment from the whole trip was when the little boy whose garden we were building gave us all a hug as we were leaving, which really showed how much he appreciated us making their vegetable patch. We dug a total of six vegetable patches for the Community in our two days in Nyanga working with Etafeni, an organisation that teaches gardening to help communities grow their own vegetables and ensure they have food to eat. They aim to build 200 gardens a year and they only had 18 left to build after we finished working with them this Summer.

It was humbling to work in the Township where our work was very much appreciated. The children there all wanted to help us with the gardens; a lot of them didn't go to school and didn't have any shoes to wear. We took some skipping ropes and bubbles with us for them and it was like Christmas! In the evenings and on the weekends we did different activities such as drumming, a surfing lesson, horse riding on the beach and a safari drive. Our host family was very accommodating, making us all feel welcome and comfortable. South Africa is an incredible, beautiful country that taught me a lot within a short space of time. I would definitely recommend visiting and for anyone that gets an opportunity to take part in a volunteering trip, definitely take it up!

I will be having a presentation evening at Cruwys Morchard Parish Hall on 2 December at 7pm to show everyone my amazing experience. All welcome.

The storms abated to bring glorious sunshine on Remembrance Sunday, for the special events at St Margaret's Church to mark the centenary of the end of World War One. The Church, superbly decorated with poppies knitted by many local people, was full for the very moving service. June Jones read a poignant poem by 'Woodbine Willie', introduced by Malcolm, and Matt Parker gave a spinetingling rendition of the Last Post and Rouse on his trumpet. After the Service, everyone assembled outside the west door, for a commemoration put together by Peter Broadbent and Roland Chant.

After an introduction, Philip Turner tolled a muffled bell: one toll for each Stoodleigh serviceman and for each local forebear who died, plus two extra tolls for those who fought and survived, and for those who kept the home fires burning. Philip Talbot then read out the names of those remembered and this was followed by seven poems written during the war.



Various long-standing local families were represented by some of the readers, as well as nine-year-old Mimi Griffiths. The readings ended with a passage from the Book of Micah and the familiar words of Laurence Binyon's For the fallen, as poppies floated down from the tower.

In the evening remembrance gave way to a celebration of the end of the war with a beacon lit on Ash Hill, while the Stoodleigh bell-ringers rang a peal. It was quite a day and we are immensely grateful to Peter Broadbent for coordinating it.

The run-up to Remembrance brought two very sad events. On the Sunday before, little Rafferty Hill, Lizzie and Chris's baby son who had been born very prematurely and had fought for several weeks to stay with us, died at St Michael's Hospital, Bristol.

Then, on the very morning of Armistice Day, June Knowles died at home at Stoodleigh Barton. She was 91. June and her husband John moved to Stoodleigh in 1976. They met in 1954 at Hutswell Farm, Oakford – on a silage heap, so the family say (John had been asked over to pull a tractor off the heap). They later married and farmed for some years at Hutswell, where their children Claire and William were born. After 14 years farming in Herefordshire they returned to Devon. John died in 2004. June continued to run the farm with William until her death. She will be greatly missed by her family and friends.

On a happier note, we extend a warm welcome to the Parish to Julian and Sam Earl at Diptford Barn.

Earlier in the Autumn we celebrated Harvest. The Harvest Supper, with skittles, was a great success and we were able to send £262 to the Devon Air Ambulance. Now we look ahead to the Christmas Fayre in the Parish Hall on Saturday 8 December from 10.30 to 12 noon. Father Christmas hopes to be with us for the morning and there will be a fine selection of stalls and generous raffle.

The hardy carol singers are planning to set off at 6pm from the Parish Hall on Tuesday 18 December. Do come and join them or request a visit by contacting Jennifer (351402).

The Rector has a busy time over Christmas and to enable Steph to take our Carol Service, this will now take place on Saturday 22 December at 6.30pm. Please make a note of this change of date. We look forward to seeing you there.
