## **FROM THE ARCHIVES**

## **'TODAY'** 50 years ago

#### February and March, 1969

The lead article in February bemoaned the "permissive society" and the 'relaxation' of standards, but welcomed the government's firm stance against the legalisation of drugs. Immigration also needed to be regulated.

An article explained the origin of "Black letter days", when contracts were dated as Saints days, and printed in black ink, and "Red letter days", which were Feast days, printed in diaries and prayer books in red ink.

The 'Continental' Sunday Bill was to be debated in parliament, which would allow commercial entertainment and professional sport to take place on Sundays. The fear was that other bills would follow leading to Sunday opening for shops ... .....

Snow and ice during February had caused some problems, including broken limbs.

Calverleigh were planning a showing of the film "Singapore Story" following their annual meeting which "shouldn't last more than half-an-hour"!

At Loxbeare, the yew tree had been removed, but the east window was in need of repair due to storm damage.

At Rackenford, the weather had resulted in a one-day closure of the school. They were to host the first Group Service away from Stoodleigh, on Mothering Sunday.



Stoodleigh were also planning a film showing following their annual meeting. They were also to hold a Country Market in Tiverton in May.

A parish meeting at Templeton had decided to purchase the old school, with a view to convert it into a village hall.

At Oakford, the Post Office was to remain open, courtesy of Mrs Tanner.

Washfield W.I. had 'come of age', celebrating 21 years.

## **NATURE NOTES**

Many of us will have travelled long distances over Christmas, to visit family and friends and I trust this commitment to love and friendship was duly rewarded. The sense of wonder, as befitting this time of year, would have been greatly enhanced by the sight of motorway roadworks, that had apparently progressed little since last year. In preference to playing iSpy anyone working, I find it more therapeutic to consider the Winter migration of birds.

First in mind is the Whooper Swan which seems to favour the West side of the country. You wonder how they decide where to settle and if the birds discuss whether to stay in Ireland or Slimbridge Wetland Centre. Whooper Swans, who desert Iceland for warmer climes in Winter, have much yellow on their bill, as do the Bewick swans and I would be hard pushed to determine the difference between them. As befits the friendly yellow colour of their beaks, they both seem to be less aggressive than our own mute swans. Certainly belligerent Bob from Somerset, recently departed at the age of 22, fitted the bill for pent up anger and notoriously demanded respect.

However, I wish to commend is the epic journey the Whooper Swans make, and the relief and gratitude they must feel by the time the Christmas feast arrives. They travel around 1,000 miles from Iceland without landfall! Compare the conversation between adults and children constantly asking "are we nearly there yet" and imagine the inexperienced swans thinking their journey was never going to end. In fact observers watch with interest the bobbing communication that the group undertake whilst debating when to go. Apparently 60% of the flock buy in to the decision to go and presumably if bad storms intervene they face death.

If you think life is tough and continual "Delays Likely" mar your journey, making it difficult, I would take a deep breath and try to put it into perspective. These birds are so good they named them twice [Cygnus cygnus].

## **TIVERTON AREA COMMUNITY TRANSITION**

You are probably as worn down as I am with the constant news of global disaster and by the recent news that we only have twelve years to save the plant. Hopefully you are doing your bit towards making life easier for your children and grandchildren by sorting your refuse, cutting down on plastics use, not printing emails and driving less.

The information we receive about how we can do better in this situation is often contradictory and the results seem puny beside the size of the problems. Both the government and the informed tell us that whatever we can do, does make a difference and that we should not be put off by negative news stories of unsorted recyclables, plastics being shipped to China or rubbish being dumped at sea.

There is a local organisation that has ten different groups within it working across the Tiverton area. These groups include "ReRooted" producing good healthy food from raw materials that would otherwise go to waste; "Green Energy", helping to develop fuel free transport; "Give or Take", an opportunity to give unwanted usable items to those who could use them and perhaps find things you need; "Repair Café" holding sessions across the area repairing items that would otherwise go to waste; and a soils group, an apple group, bee-keeping, community energy and others.

#### TACT works across Tiverton and the surrounding villages.

On 21 March at 7 pm it will be holding an Open Evening and a brief meeting in the Town Hall in Tiverton. Everyone will be welcome, as TACT seeks to support all our efforts to maintain a habitable planet. Do not feel defeated by the future but work with us to mend it.
