FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago

April and May, 1969

66 day's most popular pastime is to throw stones at the government, and especially the Prime Minister". So began the April lead article. [Good to know that in a rapidly changing world, there are some areas of life where things don't change!]. However, the thrust of the article was against the power of the unions, and their leaders who were interested only in their own membership, but blind to the adverse effect their claims would have on members of other unions, and the public in general. "No matter which party is in office, there is no hope of national recovery until we lose our selfishness and recover Christian ideals".

On the home front, Rackenford Church was filled for the Group Mothering Sunday Service, with a robed choir of no less that thirty-five young people.

Stoodleigh were planning a country market to help with Group expenses.

An experiment at Withleigh to have an 8am Holy Communion Service during the winter months had proved less than successful.

In May, the Rector voiced his 'serious misgivings' about the idea of the UK joining the 'Common Market'!

Grateful thanks were expressed to our sheep farmers who looked after sheep on behalf of the Parishes, the regular income from which went towards the cost of repair and restoration of our Churches. Almost two pages of the magazine were given over to the centenary of the publication of "Lorna Doone" [now 150 years in 2019], with various suggestions



as to on whom the Doones were based, and what was the location of the Doone Valley.

Members of Calverleigh W.I. had responded to the question, "What do you like or dislike about Tiverton?" with many adverse comments on the new floodprevention wall opposite The Walronds!

The internal decoration of Loxbeare Church had been completed.

Celebrations were planned for Rackenford W.I. celebrating its 21st birthday.

Work had started on the rebuilding of Templeton Church tower.

A dedication Service was to be held for the Washfield PCC. A village outing to Paignton was planned – adults fare 6/6d $(32\frac{1}{2}p)$, children 4/6d $(22\frac{1}{2}p)!$

Withleigh were to hold a Beetle Drive in aid of the Withleigh Wasps football team.

NATURE NOTES

Now that the sukebind is due to invade the hedgerows, it is hard to avoid realising the plans made for your gardens and the joy of Spring. But how many will have made a vow to avoid the coverage of the Chelsea Flower Show as I did last year? It happened to me as I saw the drawings of the plan view of 3 gardens [that the designers wished to create] and the result was presented in aerial views of the 'real thing' – all involved should take enormous credit from the perfect reproduction. However much as I envy the planting knowledge, I feel it differs little from interior design taken outside, and save for the heroes in the nurseries it doesn't feel like communing with Nature.

Similarly I would direct your attention to the Adachi Museum garden [sometimes entitled 'of Art'] in Japan. This garden is so perfect that you are not allowed in it, and have to view it through windows or from contrived viewing points. Our garden may fall somewhat short of this (!) but it too benefits from a borrowed landscape. What we borrow is not only seen but is dynamic, and one can even hear and smell it. The contribution ranges from slow moving livestock to the imperious pines which whisper and move to warn of changes in wind direction and release scent down the garden as the humidity rises with the approach of evening.

The reverence for nature is also enhanced by knowing the garden space is only ours to share with other creatures. A peacock butterfly in February [?], the gentleman robin acting as doorman every time you leave the house, the summer dragonflies, the skittish wild life and even the insect life which is certainly not reducing here. Nature is sometimes unkind on what it allows us to successfully grow and I should record that a gardener does not meet or treat triumph and disaster just the same. Perhaps better to summarise by saving 'The glory of the Garden lies in more than meets the eye'
