FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago

June and July, 1969

The lead article in June criticised the permissive attitudes of the day, and their effect on society with the wateringdown of morals. The July article focussed on what constituted the 'Point of Death', considering the ability to then keep somebody technically alive, though 'brain-dead'.

Being two minibuses short this year, the cost of transport to 'Holidays at Home' was going to be more expensive than previously, and parents were to be asked to, if possible, pay their children's fares.

The Bishop of Crediton was to open the Group Fête at Easterlands, Stoodleigh, in July.

Members of Oakford's W.I. were planning a 21st anniversary celebration at The Green Headland Hotel in Sampford Peverell.

Rackenford's W.I. members, along with their husbands, celebrated the branch's 21st anniversary with dinner at The Ruffwell, followed by singing and dancing.

Rackenford School marked the centenary year of "Lorna Doone" with a visit to Oare church and the Doone Valley, with time on the beach at Minehead. The Sunday School and choir were planning an outing to Teignmouth in July.

Stoodleigh had held a sheep sale at Tiverton market, which had raised $\pounds 50$ for church funds. A country market had raised $\pounds 29.3.1d$ for Group funds.

Under the heading "Isolated Places", Templeton was described as "an isolated parish with no village". At the time of the Black death (1349-50), the dead were collected by cart loads from surrounding farms, and taken by night to the mother church of Witheridge for burial. It was some time later that burials took place at Templeton – and then only after a duel between the Rector of Witheridge and the priest at Templeton!

The re-building of Templeton's church tower was now essentially complete.

Washfield PCC had decided to hold a country market in Tiverton instead of a fête.

The young people of Withleigh completed a sponsored walk of fifteen miles to raise money towards a new mini-bus for the Group. In the process, they had set foot in eight of the parishes, Morebath being the exception.

NATURE NOTES

Springtime departs, regretfully and all from cricket watchers who may feel hypothermia will become less of a threat. The emergence of new life and colour never ceases to amaze, even though it happens every year. I also find that I will experience at some time during the season, an event view or display that indelibly imprints itself on my mind, thus rendering each Spring unique and special. This year my abiding memory will be of an invisible trigger that inspired the whole animal kingdom into a surge of activity. It started with deer roaming in fields by the house every evening such that the visits became predictable and thus ignored by all but visitors. These shy animals, and similarly badgers, then decided to think nothing of being seen in the lane at odd hours.

The song birds spent a time when they were too busy to come to the feeding stations but their song was ever present during all daylight hours and sometimes beyond. Many remark on the dawn chorus but much of this is the replacement of silence by a lovely and increasing sound – however it is just as charming during the day but because it is incessant we do not hear it - so I made myself stop and listen. It is remarkable how much we take for granted - the colours of the male pheasant, the corkscrew flight of the buzzard, the greater spotted woodpeckers hammering out their Morse Code.

Well this year they came all at once and were not to be ignored - the male pheasants decided to claim their territory by acting like cockerels in our garden at ungodly hours, the buzzards issued reminder calls as they soared, and the drumming of woodpeckers along the valley indicated either we are infested with them or we have a serious number of dead trees all with their own peculiar note.

I totally accept we have a global biodiversity crisis and I list much of the above not as a rejection but as a self reminder to never take any of everyday Devon scenes for granted, whatever the season.

CRUWYS ARMS GARDENERS met on Wednesday 3 April and ten members discussed control of garden pests, passing on gems of information on the control of Aphid and Blackfly with a mixture of mint, garlic and cayenne pepper boiled together and sprayed onto affected plants. (any surplus can be used for a chilli !!) White rot spores can survive for up to 18 years, until they respond to the volatile chemicals produced by onion, producing mycelium. A garlic drench encourages the spores to react, producing mycelium, thereby exhausting the dormant spores. Vine weevil can be controlled with nematodes in the Spring. Pigeons can be deterred by netting or sudden noises, releasing dogs and young children always works! Carrot fly is a low flying insect, so high beds or a low fence around them helps. Also planting between rows of "smelly" plants masks the odour of the carrots and confuses the invading flies.

Wednesday 8 May, when we discussed club root in brassicas, lime helps.

A garden safari around Puddington, the Pennymoor Gardens will follow later.

And an away day at Shepcott Barton on the afternoon of 12 July.
