### QUARTER CENTURY OF MINISTRY IN THE EXE VALLEY

Sadly it is time to say "Goodbye". Marion and I moved to East Sidborough in January 1993, the longest time we have lived in one house since our marriage in 1969. We have loved our time here, I fell in love with Devon when I was at school in Barnstaple for five years, after World War 2, and Marion was born and bred just over the border in Somerset.

But life moves on, The Lord is telling us that it is time to move nearer family, so we are off to Shropshire within the next month or so, near to our daughter Charmian and closer to York, where our son Matthew is a Church Minister. Our over-arching feeling is one of deep thankfulness, mixed with a tinge of sadness, at leaving so many friends from the Exe Valley. Thankfulness to you all for your welcome, friendliness and appreciation of my ministry amongst you, and the welcome received in regular ministry in each of the nine churches of the Exe Valley; but special thankfulness to those nine clergy amongst whom I have been privileged to work - 5 Rectors\* and 4 Team vicars\*\*. I have learnt so much from them and I thank them for putting up with my idiosyncrasies and trust that my time as a team member and Licensed Assistant Minister, (latterly having the Bishop's Permission To Officiate, spot the difference!) has been of some help and encouragement to them over the years.

Above all, my thanks must be to the Lord Jesus Himself for the immense privilege of being an ordained minister of the Gospel, being free to preach the Gospel and teach the Bible. My memories extend from leading regular services in each of the nine churches, to the Alpha courses in the early days held at The Mill, Lower Washfield, to the Christianity explored courses in Washfield Hall and Oakford Hall when we discovered from Mark's Gospel, who the Lord Jesus really is. It was a joy and a privilege to see folk come to faith in Jesus and others revitalise their faith. Further memories include the TROGS young people's group and the many Home Group evenings which have been such a precious part of our experience here, where closer friendships have been forged.

When we came to the Exe Valley, the stipendiary clergy had just been reduced from four to three and there was concerned discussion as to how we were going to manage with only three full time clergy!. As time went on this was further reduced to two, to one and a half and of course now to just one. It became increasingly obvious that if regular worship was to be retained in all our churches then it would be necessary to train lay members of the congregations to lead services. When Andrew Rose and I started the SEAN lay leaders' training course, I think I am right in saying that only two parishes had any lay led services; volunteers quickly came forward for training and a course of action was put in place which has been continued under Steph's leadership so that all parishes now have some services led by members of the congregation.

The above are just some of the memories of a quarter-century in the Exe Valley. Our names first appear in the Loxbeare visitors book on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 1992 and I took my first service in Loxbeare church at 3.00pm on 17<sup>th</sup> October 1993, in my capacity as Reader, since I was not ordained until the following year.

So again, thank you for all that you have given to Marion and myself over these many years. We have been so happy in the Exe Valley and are, of course, sorry to leave. I have tried to be faithful to The Lord Jesus and to the scriptures which testify about Him and pray that the Exe Valley will always be a Group of churches which put the Bible at the forefront of their preaching and beliefs.

### **'TODAY' 50 years ago** August and September, 1969

The lead article in the combined August / September issue focused on the recent Apollo 9 moon landing, and the 'confident' prediction that, "... within fifteen years we shall be on Mars"! Whilst admiring the achievement, the suggestion was that it had come about for all the wrong reasons, born out of political rivalry between the USA and USSR, based on fear of what the other might achieve.

On a brighter note, the Group Country Fair at Easterlands was not lacking in superlatives when it came to opinions of its success. Even the Bishop "....admitted that there isn't another Group in the Diocese quite like ours"! The total raised was £363.

Members of the Mothers' Union had decided that they needed to get out and get on with jobs, rather than just sitting and listening! An action group was to begin at Withleigh Rectory in October.

A Sunday night concert at Calverleigh had raised £34 for the Spastics Society.

The 1st Oakford Girl Guides had enjoyed a treasure hunt in the grounds of Holme Place, and six guides ran the children's corner at the Group Country Fair. They had also attended their first church parade.

The Rackenford sports day had been a great success, with tea sales breaking all records. "With a double sitting at the Gaiety Hall, folk could just be squeezed in". The Sunday school outing to Teignmouth had enjoyed the sunshine.

The Stoodleigh ladies netball team was flourishing, playing at least one match every week. It was hoped that more parishes within the Group would be able to raise a team next year.

The Withleigh sponsored walk had raised  $\pounds$ 110 towards the cost of a new Group minibus.

### NATURE NOTES

When the sun shines it is hard to resist the lure of Cornwall, although the journey is always surprisingly long. We are comforted by the thought that the time away allows our new neighbours more uninterrupted time to settle in.

The first was the family of robins. They nest in the bank by the house and their home is not structurally complex but always appears cosy and dry. Even in the poor light of dusk you can see the yellow and radiant open beaks of the chicks as they clamour to be fed. They have long since departed and our attention rapidly turned to the swallows which arrived before the house martins. This year the former decided to build their nest in our 'lean to'. Much mud, straw and grit was collected from the paths and stream and the result is a scruffy lump in the corner, where two roof supporting beams meet. The prospective parents are incredibly alert and immediately depart when they detect any sound or movement around our back door. Their movement is so fast that you have to recover from the flash of black that may be uncomfortably near your head, before the beauty of their flight can be appreciated. It is hard to avoid the feeling of guilt when you need to get something from the lean to, and you enter like a burglar.

Unfortunately the house martins aborted their nest building efforts. As with the swallows it was a two bird job but was slower, requiring many more excited cries and skill but we are only left with lines of graffiti in preparation for their nest in the eaves. Knowledgeable birders inform me that the most likely reason for a halt being called would be the death of one of the pair.

The gloomy mood was not improved by what seemed to be smaller numbers of seals and nesting birds at the coast. It was therefore heartening to hear of the great success story at Lundy where nesting numbers have greatly increased thanks to effective conservation efforts. I hope similar care will extend to our fish stocks – we are surely better than the greedy herring gulls, out for easy pickings by cathedral green or coast.
