FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago **October and November, 1969**

he lead article in the October issue berated MPs for voting along party lines, rather than by conscience or by the wishes of the people who had elected them. Apart from guerying the change to metric, it also asked the question, "Who wants to go into Europe?" "If ever there was a need for a referendum, this is it"! The pending change in the education system in town to comprehensive, was also questioned.

Back in 1961, ours was the only 'Group' in the Exeter Diocese, but from now on we are officially 'The Exe Valley Group'.

October had proved to be a glorious month, weather-wise, the best for many years.

The November issue carried the scores and table of the Junior Football League, the teams being fielded by Rackenford, Morebath, Oakford, Withleigh, Calverleigh/ Loxbeare, Washfield/Stoodleigh (in table order at the time!).

Loxbeare commented that the raising of funds for parochial needs had become a way of life.

Oakford's Guide Company had camped at Esworthy on one of the wettest days of the Summer, but all had survived! They were looking forward to the dedication of their new colours in December.

At Rackenford, "A very wet pillow fight over a stream, a cross-country race up a steep hill at Washfield Bottom, and fourlegged football, were some of the crazy events in a knock-out contest arranged

between Washfield and Rackenford football teams and supporters"!

Rackenford's young people had impressed with the way they had conducted the Young Anglicans Service in September. The revival of Rackenford Revel Day was planned for All Saints Day.

Stoodleigh were planning their Christmas Fayre for mid-November.

The closure of Templeton's 100 year old little Methodist Chapel following its Harvest Festival at the end of September was a sad day. The members would have the choice of going to Loxbeare Chapel or Templeton Church. The Church was planning a sale in Tiverton Market in December.

Washfield W.I. members would be around Carol Singing on 20 December, and the Youth Club were putting on a pantomime. A working party was being formed to repair some of the Hall chairs before the event.

During the three years since its reopening, the visitors' book at St Catherine's, Withleigh, had collected 800 signatures, including those of three coach-loads of visitors! A Country Market was planned to be held in Tiverton.

NATURE NOTES

ugust triggered the usual frenzy of Abedge cutting. We should be very grateful to those skilful tractor drivers with their well engineered trimmers. Some pass along the hedge several times and take so much care that the end result



is better than I can achieve manually. To those like me who still have aching backs - feel grateful that you own a piece of living architecture and archaeology.

It is suggested that if you take a 30-yard hedgerow and count the number of woody species, then their number equals the age of the hedge in centuries. More simply, the depth of the hedge and steep banks is indicative of great age. The presence in a hedge of bluebells and primroses reflects that the hedge came in place of ancient woodland. It is likely that such clearance occurred in the 18th Century when the most vigorous drive for enclosing land came into force.

Children picking the flowers today may like to reflect that they are the antique plants of many generations before. The children's ancestors, like the plants, may also have been in the wrong place, as country folk hated the introduction of hedges because they prevented free access to the land and they were forced to join the drift into towns to survive.

These very hedges now provide great protection, reduce the risk of soil erosion and capture many different seeds which can germinate and flourish. In this time of Brexit it is ironical to talk of boundaries but it may be timely to reflect on something we do without any economic concern.

Any stranger flying into Britain will see something they have never seen before a unique mosaic of differently coloured fields divided by hedges, lines of trees or dry stone walls. At least one act of Parliament brought us some good in the end.

Sunday 11 November Remembrance Sunday Service. Please come to this Service of Remembrance which commemorates all the servicemen and women who died during the two World Wars and during other conflicts across the world. Martin Hansford has kindly agreed to lead this service at Templeton again this year. You will have probably noticed that four soldiers from Templeton, who died during the first World War, are commemorated on a plaque in the Church just on the left of the door:

Private Sidney Darch Cruwys, son of George and Hannah Cruwvs of Town Cottage, died on 6 September 1916 aged 20, and his brother, Private Frank Cruwys died on 9 February 1917 aged 20. Private Reginald Warren, son of William and Eva Warren of Coombe Mill (now Dartcoombe Mill) died on 15 September 1918 aged 22.

Private Edwin Tucker, son of Samuel and Harriet Tucker died 18 September 1918 aged 29.

'At the going down of the sun and in the morning. We will remember them.'
