FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago

December, 1969 / January, 1970

December's editorial spoke of the Nativity Scene that is familiar to us, all clean and sweet-smelling, a far cry from the reality of the situation – cobwebs, insects, dirt, squalor, and smelling of the animals and all that goes with them; the last place in which you would wish to give birth. And, amongst all the clamour of the season, a plea, "Oh hush your noise, ye men of strife, and hear the angels sing".

January's put forward the suggestion that airport runways should be circular(!), since life is rather like going round in circles, with the cycle of seasons, days and phases of the moon, all akin to the book of Ecclesiastes. But, in going round and round, we shouldn't remain in the same plane, but our lives should be ever spiralling upwards towards our Heavenly destination. Arctic weather and a flu bug had combined to make life difficult across the Valley.

A simplified Evening Service took place at both Stoodleigh and Calverleigh on 28 December, followed by the screening of the film "The Candle-Maker"

Christmas Fayres / Sales were in full swing, Rackenford's having raised $\pounds 60$ for Church Funds, and that at Stoodleigh having raised $\pounds 63$.

Oakford's Halloween Sale had raised £32.9s.0d. A special Service had seen the dedication of the Girl Guides' new colours.

Rackenford's Carol Singers raised £20 to be split between the Blind and the Children's Society. The Young Anglicans had excelled with their Carol Service.



The singing at Stoodleigh's Carol Service had been boosted by choirs from Rackenford, Washfield and Withleigh.

It looked as though Templeton had now reached the point where a screen could be erected to separate the draughty belfry from the main body of the Church. A boom of children in the community had resulted in appropriate changes to Services and Sunday School.

Washfield's very successful 'First Annual Pantomime' took place over three nights during December. The Carol Singers braved terrible weather on 20 December, collecting for Blind Housewives. The children's party took place on 3 January.

Withleigh's Sale in Tiverton Market had raised £30 for Church Funds. The Choir and Sunday School Party took place on 20 December, and the Withleigh Orchestra gave its first public performance at the Carol Service. Organised by the Kingstons, two full evenings of Carol Singing at every house within the effective boundary of the Parish had raised £15

NATURE NOTES

n these dark days of Autumn it is hard not to sympathise with a pagan's yearning for the return of light or indeed question whether some arks may not come amiss in the West Country. Most look for something to celebrate, and in this time the Jewish faith enjoys their festival of Sukkot. It was originally associated with the wanderings of the children of Israel combined with giving thanks for the annual harvest, but now it seems to an outsider to have more subtle overtones. In particular it is the use of the Sukkah and an emphasis on 'getting back to nature' whilst reflecting on the ephemeral nature of life. The sukkah particularly epitomises this, and is a temporary structure built outside the house, often of the thinnest plywood but with a roof of plant material. Those celebrating the festival eat and sometimes sleep in these bivouacs that would not withstand a gale, leak and have sometimes been burnt down by a well meaning granny who drags in an unsuitable electric fire.

I have witnessed genuine attempts by adults during this period to impress on children the importance of nature. The message (especially in towns) in the dark and cold with the smell of gently rotting vegetation is stark, and helped by the contrast of the inaccessible but inescapably warm home nearby.

I cannot report on the success of these lessons but the excitement of the children in unusual surroundings lifts everyone. However I find you do not have to suffer hardships or look far at this time of year to have your spirits raised. An individual tree whilst dripping and holding on to its remaining leaves and colour, shimmers and is covered in fairy lights if the low lying sun manages to beam down the valleys. The cuttings in voghurt pots on the kitchen window-sill continue to throw wispy blond roots. the discarded branches Similarly, chopped from laurel gamely sprout emerald green roots that become snakelike in search of a home. Wizened bulbs from last year show signs of life and have joined firmer, younger contemporaries and sit comfortingly in pots in a dark corner. Yes, light can always be found.
