## **FROM THE ARCHIVES**

### **'TODAY' 50 years ago** February / March, 1970

The February lead article concerned politicians, and the choice they had to make between toeing the party line, their own feelings, and the wishes of those who had voted them into office, and the considered opinion that some had taken us too far, too fast, and sometimes in the wrong direction.

They should be accountable to those who put them in office. (An election was in the offing). In March, severe criticism was aimed at those who believed we should buy our food at the lowest possible cost from wherever in the world, rather than supporting our own farmers.

Funds had come into the Lay Committee at such a pace that the group was now in a position to buy a new minibus.

A change in the timing of the Devon General 91 bus (Witheridge to Tiverton) from the beginning of March will make life easier for those wishing to visit Post Hill Hospital.

In February, Calverleigh held a second sacred concert in aid of the Spastics Society, with 250 people attending, and raising  $\pounds 27$ .

Loxbeare's social had been postponed from Christmas until February.

Oakford's Poultry Whist Drive, in aid of Cancer Research, raised £23, despite postponement due to the weather and the flu epidemic which had ravaged the village. The Guides had enjoyed a New Year's Eve party at 'Lower Combe', but weather and flu prevented any meetings during January.

Fun and games at Rackenford's Sunday School party in January had seen two blindfolded mothers trying to feed each other jelly! The interior of the church was being given a face lift, and the first of a series of family services had been tried successfully in January. The March magazine recognised all those who work un-noticed to keep the Church functioning.

The 'Stoodleigh Beacon' focussed at length on whether there was any tie-up between the school (at risk of closure) and School Cottages. People were eager to move into the cottages if these could be sold without prejudicing the future of the school.

Templeton's Church Tower was in need of further work to remedy leaks where roots of the tree which had formerly grown out of the wall had been removed. Templeton were raising funds through the sale of 'rich farm manure' at 3/- for a  $\frac{1}{2}$ cwt bag.

Washfield youth club members organised a pancake party in February which, apart from being enjoyable, had resulted in some unusual decorations in the kitchen!

With the 'Criss Cross Quiz' season approaching, Withleigh were ready to field two teams. The working party had carried out further work on hassocks, book markers, etc. The manager of Lloyds Bank in Tiverton gave the W.I. 'an interesting talk' on the decimal changeover, something which everyone was dreading! The football team had been on good form recently.

## **NATURE NOTES**

There was once a farmer who bought a derelict farm and transformed it into a great success. The Reverend, who had watched the development, congratulated him on what he had achieved with the help of God. The farmer comments that on the evidence, if left to God's devices, it wouldn't have been much without his intervention. It is a very old joke, not very funny and not helped by my presentation in a wish to save ink.

My thoughts have been triggered by the artificiality of the festive season and the lengths we go, to drag Nature out of its dormancy to be included in the celebrations. It is almost as if we need the nearness of some greenery, and the comforting thoughts of queues of hares waiting to look up at a full moon from the corner of a snowy field.

Presumably there are also some people out there who buy heather that has been dyed. I would be very interested to know what they do with it as the supermarket shelves seem to empty. Conversely, we have a friend who once hollowed out a beetroot and embedded a daffodil bulb and planted it. The pink daffodil was a beauty to behold.

What about the 79 Christmas trees decorated by local groups around the Crediton Parish Church and the uplit trees at Knightshayes that must have the seal of approval? Where do we draw the line?

However, the desire to see everyone given an opportunity to meet the love of the Lord in an everyday environment is still very much on her heart and she will continue to support the work of the Charity as much as she can. For more than 31 years she has served the Lord by working in most areas and will be missed. We pray that she will enjoy her "retirement", although God may lead her in another direction in the future!

It has been decided to amend our opening hours and close at 4:30 pm on Mondays to Fridays. We have very few customers after 4:00 pm so this seems a sensible move. However, it will be kept under review and as the evening get lighter nearer Easter, we will reconsider staying open till 5:00 pm again
