### **'TODAY' 50 years ago** April / May, 1970

aster had been early, and particularly Cold, and the editorial also bemoaned the fact that supermarkets had opened on Good Friday. The Rector's article questioned changing tastes in fashion (amongst other things), and whether mini-skirts were appropriate in church. Moral standards appeared to be in decline. Deep gratitude was recorded to the farmers who looked after 'parish sheep', and the contribution this made to maintaining our church buildings. A degree of neglect over the years was now resulting in substantial repair bills. The value of public demonstrations was questioned, particularly in respect to farmers causing traffic chaos with parades of slow-moving tractors. The grievances being born in frustration by the farmers were wholly understandable, but was there not a better and more effective way of highlighting anv organisation's problems?

At Oakford, repairs and repainting of the east end of the church were completed in time for Easter. The Oakford Girl Guides were out to do their bit in the Guides Jubilee year, including a spurt in interest badges. The local football team was congratulated on having had a wonderful season.

Rackenford was witnessing an increase in interest from young people wanting to join the choir. Both Rackenford 'A' and Withleigh 'A' reached the semi-finals of the Junior Quiz matches, but were unfortunately drawn against each other. Bragging rights for the semi eventually went to Rackenford, but sadly they were narrowly beaten by Crediton in the final. With new houses being built in the village, the Stoodleigh Beacon focussed largely on the relative costs of septic tanks and mains drainage which was far more expensive per household.

Templeton's population continues to grow, with more children attending family services in recent months. A publication, "Jottings of Templeton and District" recorded similarities in surnames and house names in the local Templeton and Templeton in Pembrokeshire.

The Washfield village outing was planned for Paignton, in July at an adult fare of 6/6d ( $32\frac{1}{2}p$ ).

Withleigh's last three services had featured, not only a choir, but an orchestra as well. A Country Market in Tiverton in June was being planned.
