FROM THE ARCHIVES

'TODAY' 50 years ago December1970/January 1971

December's lead article spoke out against the watering down of our faith, criticising those members of the clergy who did not accept the gospel in its entirety, but suggested that there were some parts that were 'optional', for example the virgin birth. Also, as we had become a multicultural society, we were no longer a Christian nation.

The dangers of smoking were the subject of the Rector's article in the January magazine, smokers being twice as likely to suffer an early death than non-smokers. In the same way that the health service can only advise, and cannot force you to give up the habit, so God doesn't force us to stop sinning. That is also up to us, in the knowledge that sin will destroy our souls just as smoking will destroy the body.

The December column, 'Between ourselves' dispelled the belief that the Christmas tradition of excessive eating was down to the Victorians. Apparently this goes back at least to Elizabethan times, when the recommended fare was, "Beefe, mutton and porke, mince pies of the best, pig, veale, goose, capon and turkey well drest, cheese, apples and nuts". (Phew!!).

The January issue mentioned the imminent closure of the Lamb Inn in Tiverton, then talked about how many inns feature animals in their name. Also mentioned was the existence (then!) of 1,099 named 'The Rose and Crown'.

A quote from the Children's Society magazine, related to the cost of living going up, stated that, as an example, the 1d increase in the cost of a pint of milk would cost the society an extra $\pounds4,600$ a year.

Winter colds and 'flu may have been with us again, but throughout the Exe Valley carol singing was very much to the fore.

An appeal was made for the collection of used postage stamps for missionaries.

Calverleigh were to show the film "John Wesley" in the village hall.

Loxbeare's New Year's party was held in two parts – one for children, and the second for everybody.

Oakford had set up a fund to buy Christmas flowers for church, it being considered unfair for one flower arranger to have to bear the cost when flowers are at their most expensive. A Christmas lunch, organised by the W.I., was served to no less than sixty senior members of the parish. The Christmas Fayre raised just over £58. The Guides went carol singing to raise money for Save the Children.

Rackenford's Christmas Sale had raised £120. The sacred concerts at both the church and the chapel were well attended. The carol service was taken by the Young Anglicans, enabling Rev. Tull to sit in church "amongst his flock". At Stoodleigh there was concern that about £120 would need to be raised for duplicating equipment, so that production of this magazine could continue. Social events included poultry whist-drives, and a dance in aid of the Shillingford Kidney Unit. Also asked was the question, "is it too much to for a more modern, or convenient, church heating system"?

Templeton's Carol Service was augmented by Withleigh choir.

Washfield's Children's Christmas party was free to children, with a charge of 3/- for adults.

The Last Post and lowering of the flag really made Withleigh's Service of Remembrance. The Country Sale in Tiverton Market had raised over £24 for church funds, while the Guy Fawkes Bonfire had raised £3.10.0 for the Sunday school. So many turned out for the carol singing that they were split into two groups, raising £18 for the National Children's Home.

NATURE NOTES

The lovely colours of Autumn have now left us but a newspaper article and our local farmer recently reminded me of how long they lasted.

The article suggested this was due to the mildness of the weather that allowed the leaves to last longer. I was also informed that the red colours in particular was due to the formation of anthocyanins and further research said that these compounds are responsible for all the darker, richer colours in all those vegetables whose antioxidant effects are especially good for you.

It is comforting to know I knew nothing and now know twice as much, with my knowledge even superior to my spell check which has decided the word for this group of chemicals is not in the dictionary.

I strongly recommend taking extra walks as an antidote to the stress of enforced isolation. The sight of flocks of rooks and seagulls when you reach more open countryside is very calming if the weather is kind and still. The soft ground provided for juicy, rich pickings and it was perfectly clear to all involved there was no need to rush or squabble.

Our neighbouring blackbirds and thrushes similarly enjoyed this time of plenty.

We meet many others on our walks and it is clear we all have had the same idea. It is obviously a nice surprise if we know them, and inevitably many tales of the countryside are exchanged.

Attending Worship in the Exe Valley Mission Community During COVID-19 What to Expect !

Before you arrive:

We can only accommodate a certain number of people at a service, so it will be essential that you book a seat via the church office 01884 250417 or email office@exevalleymissioncommunity.org or by leaving a message on the answer phone. When you book, we will take some contact details. These will be kept for 3 weeks after the service and given to Track and Trace if someone from the service later tests positive to coronavirus.

When you arrive:

The doors will open 15 minutes before the service.

Before that you will need to wait on the church path, 2 metre markings will be chalked on the path to help you stay a safe distance from others in the queue. The welcomer will let people into the building in households/bubbles. Face coverings will be required and you will be asked to sanitize your hands on arrival, then go immediately to a seat in church. The seats in church will be arranged in ones and twos at 2m intervals from each other. We ask you to go straight to a seat and to remain there for the duration of the service. Gentle music will be playing to help you pray as you wait for the service to begin. Windows and doors may be left open to allow some ventilation, so you may notice it is a little cooler than you expect.

During the service:

Single use service sheets will be placed on the pews and we ask you to take these home with you, and bring it with you next time you come to a service.

Due to aerosol spread, there will be no singing during the service.

We ask that when you are saying the responses that you speak quietly and prayerfully - again to reduce risk of droplet spread.

When we share the peace, we cannot move from our places - we will simply wave or make a sign of peace to those in other households. During Communion, only bread will be distruted. The priest will wash her hands before and after distribution. The bread will be brought to you at your seat.

If you do not want to recieve communion for any reason, that is absolutely fine

- just hold your service sheet in front of you and the priest will pray a blessing instead.

After the service:

After the priest has processed out, the welcomer will ask people to leave a row at a time. Please wait for the welcomer to ask you to leave. Please take any orders of service home with you. Please do not stop to chat while leaving the building. Once out of the building you are welcome to talk in small groups of not more than 6 in the churchyard. Please do not block other people's exit from the building and remember to stay 2m apart from people from other households.

If you test positive for coronavirus up to three weeks after the service, please let the office know.

We would like to say a big thank you to Steph for keeping Church Services going and for her help and support during the pandemic. We were just beginning to have lay led services in our Church and were looking forward to celebrating Remembrance Sunday there, however that was not to be as lockdown restrictions meant that we were not able to hold it. Thanks to Steph and Robert we were able to join the group service on the phone or on Zoom.

We are hoping to hold two Christmas Services in December on the 13 and 20 at 11.15am. These will be a simple service in order to comply with regulations. Sadly we are not able to make and distribute Christingles this year. In order to follow the Covid rules we are limited to the number that can attend which is why there will be two services and you will need to book a seat in church for your preferred date.
