NATURE NOTES

The warmth of early summer has reminded us of how lucky we were last year with the months of dry brightness through spring and summer. This year Nature seemed to hold back during the months of April and May knowing full well the time wasn't right, irrespective of David's nightly weather forecasts and cheery wave.

I am sure most of those trying to germinate seeds knew to be patient and wait but ever hopeful, I found that this trend couldn't be defeated even if seeds were cosseted in a propagator.

Perhaps the trees provide the best barometer as they looked on in their sullen greyness and so I determined to be better guided by them and the grass growth next year. At least this period provided for an extraordinary long show of primroses, early hedgerow wild flowers and blossom in the orchards. Certainly the insects and weeds did not seem to be inhibited either and the bumble bees and hornets seem to be bigger than ever.

Every year I seem to spend much time rescuing the former when they get into corners that I would rather they didn't. It is not uncommon for them to collapse on the floor instead of flying off, after such rescues. I have often wondered if the ordeal, that often seems stressful for both of us, had been too much. Thanks to the radio I learned this week that a good course of action would be to provide some sugared water as they are likely to have just run out of energy as their access

It is simply another wild geranium species and like many of its cousins which spread 'like weeds' in our garden its benefit for insect life is clear to see and feel, as lockdown life seems to have made flesh juicier.
