Harvest Time: Wheat or Tare?

In Matthew 13:24-30. Jesus teahes his followers the parable of the Wheat and Tares. In this parable, an enemy plants, tares or weeds, in a farmer's field of wheat. When the servants ask the farmer if they should uproot the tares, the farmer says to let them grow together. By doing this, the wheat won't be uprooted with the tares. The farmer explains that when it is time to harvest, they should gather the tares and burn them and put the wheat in his barn.

Think about this parable. What if we thought of the wheat as good, loving thoughts and the tares as unhelpful, negative thoughts?

Now let's harvest those thoughts! Read examples of thoughts on the stems below. Colour in the stems with good loving thoughts. Leave the unhelpful. Negative thoughts white.

NATURE NOTES

As Nature's growing season comes to an end we reflect on a time when the fits and starts during this period seemed to mirror our faltering steps in trying to return to normality.

The self inflicted damage to the supply chain caused by Brexit and the pandemic simply added to the annual challenge of trying to grow things for sustenance or pleasure. This difficulty was put into further perspective when I heard on the radio that scientists have now found out that grass actually knows when it is being cut! We are asked to believe that messages are sent onwards by grass being cut, such that those awaiting the chop drive their nutrients downwards to better protect their future.

I am perfectly happy to believe this to be true despite how extraordinary it seems. I say this mostly out of humility as it is hard to truly understand what is going on.

This year – seed germination was so slow; sunflowers are tiny; the apples have not set but the soft fruit in bush and tree is plentiful; vegetables do well and grass growth has been so vigorous that some hay was gathered alongside the cattle as they were only just working on their immediate share of the fodder.

I extend my sympathy to all who have struggled with Nature to provide and those unhappy with staycations this summer. Spare a thought for weather forecasters who have to pretend they are more in control – thanks to severe weather warning that wrongly hovered over the Mid-Devon show those that were driven into the beer tent may be oblivious to the cider shortage to come.

My highlight of the season now ended was the return of the glow worms – they have only fitfully appeared over the last decade and though this was a lonely one, it was a glimmer of the promise of future glowing and more predictable summers.
