Prison Advice and Care Trust Sunday 31st July 2022 at St Mary's Washfield at 10.45am

Before the pandemic, on the 5th Sunday of the month, we were meeting together to worship, but focussing on an outside organisation. We have had speakers from the Leprosy Mission, Street Pastors, and the Persecuted church. As we emerge out of lockdown, we would like to re-establish this practice. So, on Sunday 31st July we are pleased to focus our attention on the work of PACT.

PACT is a pioneering national charity that supports prisoners, people with convictions, and their children and families. They provide caring and life changing services at every stage of the criminal justice process: in court, in prison, on release, and in the community.

PACT's vision is of a society in which justice is understood as a process of restoration and healing, in which prisons are used sparingly and as places of learning and rehabilitation, and in which the innate dignity and worth of every human being is valued. PACT works for the common good of Society, taking a public health-based approach. NATURE NOTES

Despite the worrying absence of swallows it has been a blissful Spring and early Summer in the valleys.

The pollinating insects have enjoyed an uninterrupted time whether they rely on smell, sight or a sixth sense. The blaze of colourful blossom lasted forever and as the green of healthy grass and trees takes over there is a feeling of deep contentment, shared by the cows which have assumed their normal position in the landscape. It took me just one week to reseed and grow grass!

I have been particularly captivated by the progress of bees in this period, as our garden now attracts more species than ever before. As the weeks progressed, different flowers enjoyed their favours with the heathers being first in line. Quite why the tightly beaded flowers of cotoneaster horizontalis, even at a very early stage, are so attractive to them is beyond my comprehension and the alarming buzzing suggests the need for bicycle clips.

I am almost embarrassed to relate the pleasure afforded by nesting birds but would like to report on two recent experiences. We have owned a nesting box for sparrows for a very long time and it has been lovingly repaired often. As befits town birds it resembles a block of 3 terrace houses. It has never been occupied by sparrows. However wherever the box is sited, town or country blue tits approve of the facility. The strange thing is only one box is
