NATURE NOTES

he varied landscape of Britain never ceases to amaze me. You only have to travel a relatively small distance into neighbouring counties to find very different colours of soil, stone, greenery and topography.

Although the modern world increasingly relies on ever improving navigational aids, pathfinding in this rich tapestry can often be surprisingly easy on repeat visits, even for those with a rapidly fading short term memory.

The recognition of place is never more striking than when an unannounced scene appears on television and you know exactly where the camera is. This happened recently in the programme hosted by Paul Whitehouse and Bob Mortimer when they were captured standing in the upstream stretch of the Exe by Cove bridge - it must have been last summer so how was it kept secret? They were fishing for grilse which apparently is an Atlantic salmon that had spent its first year at sea before returning to their native river to spawn for the first time.

I was quite surprised to learn how long these young fish spend their vulnerable years in the river prior to their incredible expedition, so presumably the birthplace is carefully selected. Although we know much about their adult journeys and reasons, I still think the full detail of how they navigate and manage to do it is something of a mystery.

I have only experienced salmon leaping once {in North Wales}, when spending

time by the higher reaches of the river Conwy. This river has many waterfalls . but when we arrived, these and the river were relatively quiet. However an experienced fisherman informed us to wait for the rainfall and then return. It being Wales we did not have long to wait, although even then there is a significant time lapse before the waters reach the falls.

Of all the daunting tasks! The falls are as tall as a block of flats, and the spate would knock any off their feet if they foolhardily took a shower. The amount of water is clearly necessary for the salmon's ascent, but it is hard not to think when you catch the leap in the air it represents a mark of failure. More likely, what looks like a leap of faith at totally the wrong time is just part of their life's journey and ultimately ends in success
