# **NATURE NOTES**

Crisis, what crisis" or should it be "Crisis, which crisis"? There seem to be so many. Arguably, the climate and biodiversity crises are the most serious in the long term. All too often the enormity of the challenges we face leaves us feeling powerless to act and change things for the better. As individuals our impact may well be limited. However, there is good news when it comes to the climate and biodiversity crises - collectively we have the power to make a real difference.

A recent World Wildlife Fund reported that the word's biodiversity (all the living things on our planet – from the smallest bacteria to the largest animal and plants) has declined, on average, by a staggering 69% since 1970. The UK is said to be one of the worst performers when it comes to the decline in biodiversity, largely because of habitat loss.

To help reverse the decline, virtually all of us can help by creating habitats in which nature will thrive. At its simplest, this could be by planting bee-friendly flowers in a window box. Those lucky enough to have a garden, small holding or farm have more options. Anything is better than nothing and the bigger the habitat created the better.

Using as few herbicides and insecticides as possible is a good start. Manicured lawns and intensively managed fields have their place but do nothing for biodiversity. Leaving part of a lawn or field untouched for the summer will allow the grass and wildflowers (aka "weeds"!) to thrive, providing both shelter and sustenance for wildlife. Creating a mosaic of wild areas that might include a pond, heaps of decaying wood, standing dead wood and piles of stones will give a home to a variety of creatures including amphibians, reptiles and a multitude of invertebrates.

How about going wild this summer, leaving both you and the planet better off for it?

It was good to get advice from everyone based upon the experience of working with our clay soil.

Our April meeting was in Puddington Village Hall where David Leach, Dartmoor Ranger, gave a talk illustrated with slides on the South West Peatland Restoration Project. South West Water and Exeter University are co operating in the project with the university monitoring the results. We all came away with a greater understanding of the importance of peatlands to biodiversity and carbon capture as well as some historical perspective on the loss of peat in the UK and globally.

Next month some of us are off to Ashmoor Nursery for a demonstration in the art of making hanging baskets. Those not participating will meet in the Cruwys Arms as usual on Wednesday 3 May at 8.00pm, so feel free to come along if Spring has put you in the mood for gardening.
