Most of us are content to allow Government to "do something" about reducing emissions and cleaning up the environment. However. there is also no consensus and continuity in thinking as Government environmental policy shifts with changes in political parties and leaders.

No, it isn't a spelling mistake. Like many parishes in the area, Templeton has its share of potholes. The good news is that potholes in Templeton, or anywhere else in Devon, can be reported here: https://www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtra

nsport/report-a-problem/report-apothole/ Potholes that have a 40 mm (4 cm) vertical edge and are 300 mm (30 cm) wide will be repaired. So if you come across a treacherous pothole in Templeton itself, any of the roads which lead to Templeton, or any other parishes, you can report them. When you follow this link, just find the spot on the interactive map. There is also an emergency phone number - 0345 155 1004 - if a pothole presents an imminent threat to life, serious injury or serious damage to property. If you are concerned, please report a pothole. Don't assume that someone else will. If several people report the same pothole,

that is also important because it helps Devon County Council to assess the potholes and the roads in question. Thank you to Templeton Parish Council for this information. Now let's move from holey to holy!

an interesting insight into places of worship which have been in Withleigh over the past 623 years. The earliest record dates from 1400, with the first Chapel of Ease. The secon chapel, built in 1846 and opened in 1847, became our parish church in 1886. The day before our service, 29 April, was the feast day of St Catherine, so our patron Saint, St Catherine of Sienna was remembered.

PARISH ROUND-UP

Margaret had made some 'cattern cakes' which were originally made by the lace-makers for the patron saint- St Catherine of Alexandria, who was possibly the saint chosen for our first chapek in 1400. These cakes are spiced with cinnamon, fruit and caraway seeds, the recipe going back to Tudor times. The cakes were enjoyed with our coffee at the end of the service. Margaret gave each of us a bookmark, with the prayer of St Catherine, "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world afire" Thank you Maragret, for your research, your talk and the 'cattern cakes'.
