# **NATURE NOTES**

## There's a Buzz in the Churchyard

t's an overcast but warm afternoon in early July as I collect my delivery allocation of "Today" magazines from the church porch in St Catherine, Withleigh. Passing under the beautifully crafted millennium arch that straddles the church gates, I enter the churchyard and make my way up the path.

There's not a breath of wind. The leaves on the majestic lime trees that surround the churchyard are motionless. Below them the graveyard has undergone a transformation since my last visit. With the dazzling display of spring and early summer wildflowers over, the faded blooms and long grass have been removed. Order has returned.

As I make my way along the path, I become increasingly aware of a buzzing sound. The churchyard is alive with the sound of insects. It's all around me. It's as if it is emanating from the surround sound of an upmarket hi-fi system, the speakers hidden in every corner of the churchyard. Puzzled, I go to investigate.

First, I notice that the lime trees are bathed in delicate, heavily scented pale-yellow yet rather inconspicuous blooms. Then I spot a bumble bee visiting one of them. Scanning the tree canopies there aren't masses of bees to be seen but, collectively, throughout the churchyard there are clearly enough to fill the air with the sound of their beating wings as they search out the bountiful energy rich nectar on offer. They must number in the hundreds, if not thousands. With so many of our insect populations in free fall, I am reassured that the bumblebees in Withleigh appear to be doing well.

Entering the porch, I look up to see four pairs of beady eyes staring back at me, their large red bibs peeping over a cupped nest made of mud. The young swallows are close to fledging. Hirundines, a family of birds that includes both swallows and house martens, are struggling as are the insects that they feed on. I am comforted to see that these swallows have neither been evicted nor completely excluded from the church porch despite the threat of a few droppings appearing on the floor below or landing on the head of an unfortunate parishioner!

Having collected the magazines from the porch, for a few precious minutes, I sit myself on the nearby bench and enjoy the sights and sounds of nature that are all around me.

Is your churchyard buzzing with wildlife? I hope so, both for your sake and that of the local wildlife.

Oakford's Wildlife Warden.

Hello, I would like to introduce you to the Mid Devon Wildlife Warden Scheme, an initiative set up and supported by



New Prosperity Devon and Mid Devon Wildlife. The Scheme supports parishes across Mid Devon to create wildlife groups and train 'Wildlife Warden' volunteers to best encourage action for the environment in the areas of farming, public spaces, nature and gardens.

It is a very positive scheme that provides regular talks, workshops and support when needed. I have volunteered and I know that there are lots of knowledgeable people in our community. I would love to see the scheme grow in our parish.

I would like to hear from anyone within the Oakford parish who would like to work together to support the natural environment around us. I am very keen to keep the issues we consider local to Oakford as we are only a small community and only a small group of 'active' individuals.

We have recently been working on the control/eradication of Himalayan Balsam from the sewage works at Townmead down to Iron Mill Stream. A small group of very dedicated enthusiasts has been out pulling and cutting this very invasive weed that is likely to cost all us taxpavers £Millions over the coming decades. H. Balsam has a seedbed that only survives a maximum of 2-3 years in the ground, unlike many plants whose seeds last for decades if not centuries, so eradication is very possible. If we can prevent any one area from seeding for 2-3 years we should have effectively eradicated it from that area. We have started at the sewage works as that appears to be the source of seed contamination going down to Iron Mill Stream. We would dearly like more

hands on deck for next years onslaught as the plant isn't always easy to see, in the undergrowth, until it comes into flower and then we only have a short window in which to pull it before it sets seeds. Every plant has the potential to spread up to 700 seeds with exploding pods, so even one plant pulled is of huge benefit.

Please get in touch if you have concerns about environmental issues around our beautiful parish or if you would like to help or be involved in any way. Assistance doesn't have to be the boots on the ground type we can use 'techy' types, planners and coordinators, all sorts.

For all the upcoming events in Templeton, we are keeping our fingers crossed for good weather.

Countryside Crime and what we can do about it

The recent NFU Mutual Rural Crime Report, published in August, warns that crime across the UK has shot up by 22%, costing £49.5m nationally in the last year. Losing vital machinery and equipment causes huge disruption to farmers who are already stretched to the limit. Replacing equipment in the current economic situation can take months, adding further stress.

Devon and Cornwall police are asking people to join their 'Devon and Cornwall Alert Community Messaging'

(https://alerts.dc.police.uk) service which allows people to share crime prevention messages, and crime appeals specific to where they live. The police ask people to review their security and consider prevention as their first step to avoid their property being stolen, and for people in rural communities to be vigilant and to look out for each other. Phone 101 if you see any odd, unusual or suspicious activity, consider your own safety but if you can, try and get a registration number and description of any vehicle noticed, and phone 999 if you believe a theft is taking place.

#### St Margaret's Church – Update

Work on the Church and Churchyard is ongoing. The Churchyard is well maintained, and this year there has been an abundance of wild flowers, the beautiful especially orange hawkweed, known as Fox and Cubs. The interior walls of the church will have expert attention with the appropriate lime wash, plus work to the beautiful stonework expose surrounding the windows. Of course, the costs involved means that the work will be carried out in stages. The PCC has arranged for a quote for work to be carried out on the area behind the altar.
