## NATURE NOTES

It is sad when the swallows leave. They gather, gliding, effortlessly soaring and swooping and filling the sky with their joyful song. Suddenly, they have gone and the sky is left empty, awaiting the winter storms. The feeling that their return and Spring is a long way off is overwhelming as we face grey clouds, torrential rain, icy blasts and maybe icicles and snow!

Yet there are signs of the hope of Spring already. The rutting red deer creating new lives, acorns hiding beneath gold, brown and orange leaves are preparing to send out tiny shoots, squirrels are hoarding acorns, beech and cob nuts in anticipation of Spring before they slip into their dreys to sleep out the winter. In the UK, squirrels do not actually hibernate, but do retreat to their dreys in spells of bad weather.

I have been competing with the squirrels for nuts, acorns and also chestnuts, hoping they will grow in pots in my garden and can be transplanted to hedgerows and meadows when tall enough. Two chestnuts from Knightshayes and several oaks are growing from last year, so I am ever hopeful for this year's scavenging. We have gathered seeds to dry, carefully stored apples and onions and our cupboards are filled with jams, jellies and home-made wine.

I wander along the narrow lanes and hedgerows, noticing the colours and smells of Autumn and the daily changes. The trees in their autumnal best, green and red berries of holly and hawthorn, indigo sloes, snowberries, green, red and purple blackberries, the brilliant blue of crushed beetle wings give clues as to a fox or hedgehog's diet and bees and butterflies cluster round the Michaelmas daisies.

Muck spreaders send the farmyard scent on the breeze, bracken and mosses fill the air with their damp peaty smell and sometimes, a waft of perfume from late honeysuckle, quince and roses floats by.

Difficult to visualize Keats's golden days of Autumn when the rain sweeps across the hills and the last leaves are blasted from the wavering branches! However, although the landscape appearance changes unceasingly, Devon is always green and beautiful: a constant in our passing lives.
