Cruwys Morchard and Puddington Gardeners

Our first meeting of 2024 was in The Cruwys Arms on Wednesday 7 February.

We discussed the reasons for pruning, which included raising a tree canopy and thinning to let in light and air flow with the aim of producing more or better fruit and flowers. Sometimes it may just be to produce a more pleasing shape. Pruning is also used to create a thicker hedge and one member has recently laid a long stretch for this purpose. Almost all garden birds that don't use ledges or holes (natural or made by us) need a thicket to nest in, whether that is a hedge or a rough patch of bush and bramble that is encouraged to be impenetrable to predators and provide shelter from the weather. Many insects thrive in this habitat; an essential part of the ecosystem with lives of their own insects are not just bird food.

All pruning of deciduous plants needs to be done before the sap rises.

As always discussion ranged widely over a number of garden topics and tips were shared.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday March 6 in The Cruwys Arms and we will be taking along gardening books to swap, share or give away. There will also be our surplus seeds to pass on. All welcome whether members or not.

The Oakford Wildlife Warden scheme is ongoing and growing in numbers. We cannot do what we want to do for the natural environment of our parish, without your help and assistance, so thank you all who helped out last year.

PARISH ROUND-UP

Anyone interested in joining our small and dedicated bunch of nature lovers is more than welcome to get in touch.

The main project on our agenda at the moment is the control/eradication of the highly invasive Himalayan Balsam. This plant starts off infesting our parish in the SWW works behind Townmead bungalows and filters down to Iron Mill Stream and from there into the Exe Valley proper. The seedbed for this plant only survives in the ground for 2-3 years (unlike many seeds that survive for decades). If we can attack it before it seeds each year, we have a chance of eradicating it. Although obviously dormant this time of year we will gear up our efforts later in the season and organise parties to attack it at its source firstly and then further down the line in the hope that we can eventually get the parish clear of it.

We made good progress in 2023 and hope to improve on that this year. Hopefully last years efforts will make this years workload a little less daunting!!

Every member of the team has their own favourites within the wildlife world and I for one have recently taken on a new agri-environment scheme here at Hamslade which will involve coppicing, pollarding, and hedge laying, all in an effort to enhance the natural environment and increase diversity.

As always, if you have any concerns regarding the natural environment within our parish then please do highlight this to me and we will do what we can to address the issue.
