NATURE NOTES

Caring for God's Acre

Iconic buildings in the heart of our communities, our parish churches are places of great beauty and, despite falling congregations, remain a muchloved focal point. Steeped in history, some parish churches have stood for 1,500 years having been built by individual thegns (lords) as far back as Anglo-Saxons times (450 AD-1066 AD). The oldest parish church (St Martin's in Canterbury) is said to date to about 590 AD.

Many of the present churches in the Exe Valley Mission Community were built in the 12th, 13th and 14th centuries. Some of them may well have superseded other places of worship that had stood on the same site prior to their arrival.

You might well ask, "What has all of this got to do with nature?". Believe it or not, a lot! When they were built, manv of our churches were constructed in open countryside and, not having an enclosed churchyard at the time, the site would have been an integral part of the surrounding landscape. Gravestones would have been largely absent; the less well-off members of the community being buried in what was effectively an open field. Only the wealthy would have had a gravestone or monument to mark their place of rest. The churchyard might well have been grazed, could easily have had a hay cut taken off it and some would have been used for village events.

As both their origins and their management regimes would have been comparable to, if not identical to, the pastureland in which they stood, early churchyards would have had plant communities closely akin to the countryside beyond them. With the passing of time, most churchyards were enclosed but their management regimes continued to mirror the hay cuts and/or grazing in the wider landscape.

With the arrival of agricultural intensification, farming methods have transformed our landscape. 97% of wildflower-rich meadows have been

lost in the last 100 years and, with them, much of the biodiversity that they once nourished.

Our churchyards have largely avoided the ploughing, reseeding, early silage cuts and the widespread use of herbicides and pesticides deployed by modern agriculture beyond their walls. Many have become a precious "time capsule". A window into a bygone age. But, most importantly, with sympathetic management God's Acre can be an invaluable repository for the myriad of His living things (the wildflowers, trees, lichens, insects, reptiles, birds and mammals) on whom we must share our planet and, on whose health, ultimately, we all depend.

For inspiration and the opportunity to see what others have achieved in their churchyards or if you simply want to see, hear and smell a window into the meadows of a yesteryear, please visit Holy Cross Church (Cruwys Morchard) this summer. Holv Cross's churchvard has a wildflower-rich meadow that is stunningly beautiful, especially on a warm summer's afternoon in June.

In fact, it is one of only six churches in Devon that feature on Caring for God's Acre's website page titled "Flowery Churchyards". The website also offers excellent support and advice as to how best to manage a churchvard for both people and wildlife.

Is it time to return a flock of sheep to your churchyard? Probably not. That could well be a step too far for parishioners and conservationists alike. A scythe, now that's a very different matter!

After lunch on 10 April, some 14 members of the Guild of Clerical Ringers rang at Loxbeare whilst on their Guild lower week annual tour, from our benefice they also rang at Calverleigh, Cruwys Morchard, Oakford, Rackenford, Stoodleigh & Washfield.



Our three bells date from 1450, in 1912, the then rickety old bell frame was replaced by a new oak frame constructed by Harry Stokes & Son, bell hangers of Woodbury.
