WHAT'S ON

NATURE NOTES

Nurturing the vegetable patch has just about beaten me this year. Firstly, the wet weather meant that everything was planted late and the only glut was that of slugs and snails. When fragile green shoots appeared, despite a year's supply of crushed egg shells and multiple copper rings surrounding them, those slimy creatures dined on my precious seedlings.

A family of squirrels dug holes in the vegetable patch and scattered the bird seed all over the flower bed. Now I have wheat growing amongst the peonies.

The blackbirds have eaten all the cherries, bar one and that is only because it is not yet ripe.

On my return from holiday last week, I wandered round the garden noting the changes which had occurred over just a few days. Lots of weeds had sprung up.

I glimpsed something white behind a shrub and walked towards it. I stopped. It couldn't be. What was it? Not sure whether to approach. Where had it come from? Mind racing. A large white Bengali tiger was staring at me. For a fleeting moment, I was anxious, thinking it was real while telling myself it couldn't be. But . . .strangely, it had blue eyes. It wasn't moving. Huge stuffed toy tiger. Our son and grandson thought it a jolly jape to bring it from the recycle centre and hide it in our garden!

Back aching as I dug out weeds, I straightened up painfully when I heard a noise behind me and caught sight of the dog digging in the greenhouse. Unfortunately, the mouse hole she was excavating was under the cucumber plant, which until this point had been managing to do rather well.

Back to the weeds which were also doing rather well. Then I discovered that the deer had been in the garden the previous evening and had pruned my roses and sweetpeas.

Feeling rather disgruntled, I sat on the garden bench with the warmth of the sun shining down from a vibrant blue sky where swallows swooped and dived and buzzards circled slowly, surveying the newly-mown fields. The dog laid her head on my knee and entreated me to forgive her.

Sparrows chirped noisily; a pair of pied wagtails searched for insects to feed their young, bobbing their tails as they waited impatiently. Bluetits hiding in the beech hedge called to each other and a greater spotted woodpecker shouted insistently to his mate. Two ring-collared doves pecked at the bird feeder and in the neighbouring field, the cattle sat together amiably, chewing the cud.

Leaves fluttered, rustling in the light breeze. The scent from sprigs of rosemary and lavender crushed between my fingers added to the sense of calm and serenity. I was surrounded by Nature's beautiful and lush greenery.
